



With the Representatives of ninety-four chartered Chapters and of fourteen under dispensation and a large number of Past Matrons and Past Patrons entitled to seats.

The Grand Chapter was then opened in Ample Form, when after singing and the offering of prayer by the Grand Chaplain, the Grand Marshal, by direction of the Worthy Grand Patron, proclaimed the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star for and in the State of California duly opened in Twenty-fourth Annual Session.

The reading of the proceedings of the last Annual Session was dispensed with, members of the Grand Chapter having been furnished with printed copies thereof.

March 30, 1896, authorized Bro. Lorenzo Anson Rockwell, Past Patron of Acacia Chapter, No. 21, to confer the degrees at sight and to organize a Chapter at Compton; and April 10, 1896, I issued a dispensation to Pearl Chapter at Compton, Los Angeles County.

April 9, 1896, authorized Bro. Roscoe Edwin Hewitt of Hermosa Chapter, No. 105, Associate Grand Patron, to confer the degrees at sight and to organize a Chapter at Anaheim; and June 6, 1896, I issued a dispensation to Chispa Chapter at Anaheim, Orange County.

April 21, 1896, authorized Bro. Granville Franklin Foster, late of Fallen Leaf Chapter, No. 90, to confer the degrees at sight and to organize a Chapter at Crescent City; and May 15, 1896, I issued a dispensation to Del Norte Chapter at Crescent City, Del Norte County.

June 6, 1896, authorized Bro. Edw. C. Winfrey of Adah Chapter, No. 122, to confer the degrees at sight and organize a Chapter at Winnemucca, Nevada; and June 11th I issued a dispensation to Silver State Chapter at Winnemucca, Nevada.

#### DECISIONS.

Nearly all of the many questions asked have been answered by a reference to the Digest. A few new points have been raised and these I have endeavored to decide on strictly Masonic lines, as instructed by the last Grand Chapter.

I have sought the advice of eminent Masons, Past Grand Masters and others, and in reference to Decisions Nos. 1 and 2, have corresponded with Eastern Masons of national reputation. These two I consider as the most important—the one as establishing the status of members, who, from ignorance or neglect and possibly no fault of their own, have not complied with the statutory reguulation; the other, as conceding to the Worthy Matron the timehonored rights and prerogatives of the "Master of the Lodge." Respecting No. 7, I would say that the previous decisions, both in our own Digest and that of the Grand Lodge, having been rendered on isolated points, are somewhat obscure, not to say contradictory. I have endeavored to cover the whole ground, proceeding on the line that as we enter the Chapter of our own free will and accord, so should we leave it, if we see fit so to do. No advantage should be taken of any technical point, nor any one forced to dimit unwillingly.

- No. 1.—It is the duty of every member to sign the by-laws, and a refusal to do so would render one liable to trial and pun ishment. But if for any reason the by-laws have not been signed, the person initiated or affiliated is nevertheless a member, entitled to all the privileges and subject to all the duties of membership.
- No. 2.—A by-law prescribing the meetings on which initiations may be held is null and void, and a motion to proceed with or to postpone an initiation or to change the order of business is out of order. The work and business of the Chapter are in the hands of the Worthy Matron, to be proceeded with in accordance with her will and pleasure, subject only to the general rules and regulations of the Order.
- No. 3.—It is the duty of the Worthy Matron to install her successor, and it is not the privilege of the Matron elect to select the installing officer.
- No. 4.—A motion to appoint a sister or brother to an office is out of order. The appointing power resides in the Worthy Matron.
  - No. 5.—A suicide may be buried by the Chapter.
- No. 6.—The "Floral Work," being neither business or work of the order, should not be given in open Chapter.
- No. 7.—All applications for a dimit shall be construed to include a recommendatory certificate and must be made in writing or personally in open Chapter. Should the Chapter refuse to grant such certificate, it is optional with the party'applying to retain membership in the Chapter or to take a dimit without recommendation. A member may withdraw an application for a dimit at any time before action thereon by the Chapter. Upon the demand of a member the Secretary shall forthwith issue a certificate of withdrawal without recommendation, but the Secretary must be assured that the member understands the nature of the certificate so obtained.
- No. 8.—The seat of honor is at the right of the Worthy Matron. It should be assumed by the visiting Grand Officer highest in rank. When visiting a Chapter in company with the Grand Matron or a District Deputy on the occasion of her official visit,

the Grand Patron may waive his claim to precedence in her favor.

No. 9.—Chapters must pay Grand Chapter dues on contributing members.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS.

A complete revision of our constitution and digest of decisions is a necessity. This should be made carefully and deliberately. A committee should be appointed to compare the constitutions of the various Grand Chapters, study their digests, and during the first six months of the year invite suggestions from the sisters and brothers. Then they should condense and arrange whatever their best judgment may decide upon, keeping in close touch in all general principles with the constitution and laws of our Grand Lodge and the ancient landmarks of Masonry. This work should be undertaken and performed with painstaking zeal, to the end that we may have a constitution that shall be a model, and then amendments will for a long time be needless. I therefore recommend that a committee of five be appointed by the incoming Grand Patron, who shall be charged with this work and who shall, if possible, report to the next Grand Chapter.

Our form of proceedings in trials is extremely defective, and I recommend that we adopt that of the Grand Lodge. It is the product of much careful labor and is as near perfection as possible.

More questions have been asked about the raps at the door than about any other one point. The Grand Officers, on consultation, decided to make no decision on the subject, but to recommend to this Grand Chapter that the Warder give the raps but twice—first when she returns into the Chapter room after having announced to the Sentinel that the Chapter is about to be opened, and last when she returns after having informed him that it is about to be closed. I believe I am safe in saying that in no three Chapters in the jurisdiction they have the same ideas on this subject. There is certainly no reason why the Chapter should be disturbed by the raps every time a member desires to leave the room. Our brethren of the other Masonic Bodies do not do it, and why should we?

I also recommend that in the march, when the officers enter the Chapter, that the Secretary and Treasurer take the places that they occupy at the Golden Chain, viz., between Adah and Ruth, and Electa and Martha respectively. The reason for this is apparent to any one who observes.

There exists a state of affairs respecting the powers of the presiding officers of the Grand and subordinate Chapters which gives rise to many questions. By our constitution and the various decisions of our Digest, the Grand Patron holds a similar position to that of Grand Master of a Grand Lodge; exercising all powers and prerogatives which law and custom confer upon that officer, excepting only those which are specifically delegated to the Grand Matron. She, on the other hand, has no power except that of granting dispensations and appointing certain officers. For while the law allows her to convene a Chapter and require conformity to the laws and regulations of the Order, she can make no binding decision as to either law or work. On the other hand, in the subordinate Chapter the Worthy Matron is supreme, the office of Patron being advisory only, and his presence even may be dispensed with, except during an initiation. Whether it is the part of wisdom to modify our laws in these respects is for this Grand Chapter carefully to consider. I have always favored the custom of most other jurisdictions, where the Grand Matron is the presiding officer, believing that she would preside with more dignity and grace than any brother could display.

The delay in publishing our proceedings has been the cause of much complaint. I have endeavored to find out the reason of this, and have discovered that it is not the fault of the Grand Secretary. The returns from the various Chapters are delinquent October 1st, and very few are in the Grand Secretary's hands much before that time, some of them coming in still later. She is then in the midst of her preparations for the meeting of this Grand Chapter, and with that meeting and the duties attending its close the month of October has passed before she can even begin the work of preparing the returns for printing. I would therefore recommend that the year close July 31st instead of August 31st, and that returns be considered delinquent September

the same precepts by the same symbols, and be in all respects, except the bare letter of the law, an integral portion of that ancient and honorable Order.

This same lack of appreciation of the importance of the institution exists to a great extent among the Masonic Fraternity.

Many, I may say the majority, regard it as but one of the societies of the day. Perhaps more ancient, certainly honorable, yet only the first among its equals.

To this serious error may be attributed most of the ills of which the fraternity complains. The vast array of nonaffiliate and suspended Masons, the small attendance at lodge meetings, the lack of interest shown in the work of the Order, and beyond all, the utter forgetfulness of obligations now so prevalent, are the direct consequence of lack of instruction in the fundamental principles of Masonry. Add to this that narrowness of soul which would confine to a single organization the use of the ancient symbols, while closing the door of that organization to vast numbers of those who would best appreciate them, and we may realize the reason why nearly one-third of those who have received the degrees in Masonry and in this Order, are to-day "outside the gate."

The Masonic historian for a long time endeavored to substantiate the claim to antiquity by searching the records of organization, and, failing there, sought by modern invention of ancient tradition to satisfy the questionings of those who seek the why and the wherefore of the teachings, and the proof of the assertions of Masonry.

Now, he follows rather the stream of thought ascending toward its source in the dawn of creation. There he finds a unique evolution of the infinite spirit of nature.

Without date of origin, without specific announcement of purpose, without a human originator, Masonry is as necessary to the development of the world as is the law of gravitation to the harmony of the spheres.

It is the Soul of Humanity, the inspiration which has originated every movement of progression, the true source of liberty of thought, of speech, of action.

To Masonry is the world indebted, not only for the preserva-

tion of the Mystic Book of the Law, but for the safe transmission through the ages of all those ideas that elevate humanity and make men better than the beasts.

Every movement throughout the history of man which has tended to the moral and material benefit of the race, has originated with and been carried on by those who owed allegiance to the ancient mysteries. From the erection of the Pyramids, the going forth of the Israelites from Egypt, the building of the first and second Temples, the Crusades and the Retormation of Luther, to our own Revolution and the liberation and unification of Italy, Masonry has been the secret spring of every effort for humanity.

It is the contriving wisdom, the executing strength, the adorning beauty, as manifested in the human soul. The unerring ultimate standard for the measurement of all things. The path to God.

Were these doctrines plainly taught, rather than vaguely hinted at, how much more energy would be displayed in work, both in and out of the Lodge, and how few would there be who from slight reasons of inconvenience, personal pique, penuriousness or *laziness*, would sever their connection with so great and glorious an institution.

"Once a Mason always a Mason," would mean something did we all believe what we profess and what we teach.

And what place or part has woman in this noble work? Debarred by an unreasoning prejudice formulated into law from participating in the present work of the organization, she still may breath the Masonic spirit and do Masonic work.

Here in the Eastern Star may woman become in all except in name, a Mason. But here, as in the Lodge, the mere passing through the ceremonies of the degrees will confer no knowledge, and unless the meaning of the symbols is impressed upon the heart, one is no better or wiser for having assumed our obligations.

Many a man has passed through all the degrees, perchance presided in the East, who has never become a Mason, while there have been and are to-day women masters of the Craft, Keepers of the Holy Fire, Princesses of the Royal Secret, having the True Word in their bosoms, who know nothing of initiations or obligations as we receive them.

Sisters and Brothers read, study. Lack of Masonic reading is responsible for much of the indifference shown by those who have assumed our obligations. The literature of Masonry is vast, most of it easily accessible, and by those whose hearts are opened, easily understood.

And finally, Sisters and Brothers, let us endeavor to manage the affairs of this Order, so far as they are committed to our care, in such a manner that we shall be a power in the land. Let our aims be high, our standard of right and duty above all others, and, marching side by side with our Masonic Brethren, let our prowess in the great battle with the hosts of Ignorance, Tyranny and Fanaticism be such as shall compel them to acknowledge us as Soldiers of Mithra and Liegemen of Honor and duty. Now henceforth and forever.

Nine of the eleven were present at the meeting, and after discussing the situation, the Grand Patron advised them to consider the question of removal, and if that was not practicable, to surrender their charter at the next session of the Grand Chapter.

Sister LINN GILLESPIE, D. G. M.—District No. 3.

The nine Chapters embraced in this District have all been visited, and with one or two exceptions found them all zealous and much interested. In every instance the utmost kindness and cordiality was shown me.

The degrees were conferred upon two candidates in a manner reflecting credit upon the officers. The Worthy Matron is earnest and faithful, and is supported by an excellent Worthy Patron. The Conductress and Associate Conductress deserve especial mention for the excellent manner in which they did their work. Books accurately kept, with the exception of the black book.

Orestimba Chapter, U. D., is the youngest Chapter in the district, but in many respects may be classed with the strongest. With the exception of one officer not a ritual was used during the entire ceremonies. They have the lessons of our Order thoroughly at heart, and work with an earnestness that would be a credit to many of the older Chapters. The Chapter room was elaborately decorated. Books correctly kept and cash on hand.

Sister Annie L. Beebe, D. G. M.—District No. 13.

This District comprises seven Chapters: Bakersfield, No. 125; Lucerne, No. 127; Lily of the Lake, No. 41; Palm Leaf, No. 114; Martha Washington, No. 13; Tulare, No. 94, and Delano, U. D. They have all been visited.

Delano Chapter, U. D. Was officially visited April 14th. I was much gratified by the work done and the true fraternal spirit displayed. This was only the second meeting after the organization of the Chapter, and the exemplification of the work would have done credit to an older Chapter. There were five candidates who received the degrees on this occasion. A delightful spirit of harmony prevails. The officers seem anxious to be properly instructed. Their hall is small, but very neat and attractive. The books are in the hands of a good Secretary. I predict for this Chapter a prosperous future.

Bakersfield Chapter, No. 125. I visited this Chapter April 15th. The Worthy Matron having called a special meeting for the purpose of my inspecting their work. As the chairs were nearly all filled by officers pro tem., the work was not par-

Patron had filled his station since the installation. The Secretary's books were in excellent order. Light refreshments were served and a social hour spent at the close of the Chapter.

Tulare Chapter, No. 94. The home of this Chapter was beautifully decorated and filled to its utmost capacity by the members and visitors from other Chapters. The ritualistic work was rendered in an impressive manner. The members seem to possess the true spirit of fraternal love, each vieing with the other in trying to make their meetings both pleasant and profitable to all. There is every indication of a continuance of prosperity in this Chapter.

Martha Washington Chapter, No. 13. On the occasion of my visit I was impressed with the spirit of revival which seemed to pervade the very atmosphere. The degrees were conferred upon eight candidates in an excellent manner, indeed, the officers did admirably. Six of the initiates were Masons, who will be a great acquisition to the Chapter. The books are in order, and finances in good condition. The decorations on this occasion were beautiful, the banquet hall being a veritable bower of roses. Good cheer and open hospitality prevailed. All departed feeling that the Mother Chapter of the District still cherished a fraternal love for her offspring. Visitors were present from four sister Chapters.

Palm Leaf Chapter, No. 114. I was most graciously received by this Chapter. The ritualistic work was well rendered, as this Chapter has an efficient corps of officers, who work untiringly to keep its standard of excellence. The Secretary's books are in perfect order, and finances in good condition. They have the hearty support of the Masonic Lodge, and all work harmoniously for the "Star." Many visitors were present. The evening closed very pleasantly with a banquet, seasoned with witty toasts and interesting addresses.

Lucerne Chapter, No. 127. Though this Chapter is young in years, the ritualistic work was well rendered. The officers have the interest of the Order at heart, and strive to place their Chapter on a high plane. Two links were added to the "Golden

Chain." The Worthy Patron showing perfection in his work. Secretary's books are well kept, and business is conducted with accuracy. Their Hall is large and well equipped. Many visitors were present. The Chapter has good Masonic support.

Lily of the Lake Chapter, No. 41, I found in excellent condition, officers showing commendable zeal, especially the Worthy Patron. After the exemplification of the work the time spent in the Banquet Hall ended one of the most enjoyable visits of the year. This Chapter has no cash book.

Sister Luella E. Cavis, D. G. M.—District No. 14.

Woodbridge Chapter, No. 118. I made my first official visit to this Chapter, and found the members full of enthusiasm and life. The work was excellently rendered. Attendance remarkably good. The Chapter is well supported by the Masonic fraternity. Books neatly and accurately kept. Money in the treasury.

Golden Star Chapter, No. 66, is in excellent condition. It has a membership of sixty-seven, all full of the spirit of enthusiasm. Few instructions needed. Books in order. Money on hand.

Queen Esther Chapter, No. 71. I went to this Chapter according to appointment, but owing to death in the Worthy Matron's family, absence and serious illness of other officers and members, no meeting was held. I called upon the Secretary and secured answers to the "list of questions." From these I find the Chapter to be very small in numbers, but in good financial condition. Books well kept. They are anxious to retain their charter and are hoping to rebuild the Chapter. Since the Deputy's visit this Chapter has changed its place of meeting from Plymouth to Sutter Creek, and with the change will undoubtedly come new life and prosperity to the Chapter.

Tuolumne Star Chapter, No. 125, has an earnest and activemembership. The degrees were conferred upon a sister in a most excellent manner. The Chapter has good Masonic support. The Secretary keeps no black book; all other books are neatly and properly kept. This is a most delightful Chapter. Harmony and goodwill prevails. My visit with them was full of joy and pleasantness and will ever be remembered as one of the brightest of my official visits.

Angels Chapter, No. 134, called a special meeting May 8th for the purpose of receiving the Deputy. This is the youngest chartered Chapter in the district, but is full of energy and ambition. The degrees were conferred on one candidate in a most excellent manner. The Worthy Matron is devoted to her work and her interest in the welfare of her Chapter is unfailing. She is generously supported by her sisters and brothers. This Chapter was without a seal, but promised to secure one immediately.

Homo Chapter, No. 50, my home Chapter, was visited officially May 27th. This being the celebration of our fifteenth anniversary, we had the pleasure of entertaining Sister Partridge, Most Worthy Grand Matron, and Brother Merritt, Worthy Grand Patron. The work was rendered in the usual excellent manner. Books are correctly kept and money in the treasury. Remarks for the "Good of the Order" were made by Sister Partridge and Brother Merritt, and were listened to with deep interest and pleasure.

Azalia Chapter, No. 77. I found the officers and members working hard to build up the Chapter, which has recently been moved from Campo Seco to San Andreas. The officers are earnest and intelligent, only needing practice to bring their work up to a high standard. Some instructions were needed, and gratefully received. Three condidates were initiated. Books neatly kept. Money in the treasury.

Summit Chapter, U. D. This Chapter was instituted in December, 1895. I found the officers and members working diligently, and hoping to merit a charter. The ritualistic work was thoroughly memorized and the floor work almost perfectly given. The members are wideawake and anxious to perfect the Chapter. They meet in a Masonic Hall and have good Masonic support.

Ariel Chapter, No. 42. Is not a large Chapter, but it is full of the spirit of harmony and hospitality, and is apparently much stronger than in the past. The degrees were conferred upon one candidate in a very impressive manner. The books are in good order. The Chapter meets in a beautiful Masonic hall. With this Chapter I concluded my official visits, and for the many acts of kindness and courtesies received from officers and members of Chapters in District No. 14 I am truly grateful.

Sister Dorothea O. Dallidet, D. G. M.—District No. 15.

Sister Dallidet, who was East at the time she accepted the appointment as one of my deputies, undoubtedly expected to return in time to perform the duties of her office, but later having decided to remain throughout the year tendered her resignation. Believing it to be too late to appoint another in her stead I assumed the duty of inspecting the District. I regret that I cannot report all Chapters in good condition. Scattered membership and financial depression have done much to dampen the Order of these Chapters that otherwise would be earnest and active.

Ventura Chapter, No. 79, has a small membership. I found them in need of much instruction and encouragement. A few years ago this Chapter had thought best to surrender its charter, and many members took out their dimits, and since the revival of the Chapter have not returned, thus taking much from its strength. However, the officers seem determined to put forth greater effort in the future to bring the work of the Chapter up to a higher standard of excellence, thereby hoping to awaken a deeper interest in the Order and increase their numbers. The degrees were conferred upon one candidate. The Worthy Patron did his work very well. Rituals were much in use by other officers. The Chapter owes much to its efficient Secretary, Brother Thompson, for his active interest in the welfare of the Chapter. Books are in good condition and some money in the treasury.

Marguerite Chapter, No. 78, is one of the best in the district, and has gained that distinction by close attention to the details of the work and the harmonious action of every officer and

member. Two candidates received the degrees. The work was thoroughly memorized and effectively rendered. Very few instructions were needed. A visit to this Chapter is surely a delight.

Mizpah Chapter, No. 100, is a thoroughly good Chapter, officers and members unitedly laboring for the welfare of the Chapter. Past officers also taking a deep interest. The work was exemplified in an excellent manner. The Worthy Patron being absent, our Grand Sentinel, Brother Travers, whose home Chapter this is, filled that position, rendering his lectures with much earnestness and dignity. Truly the spirit of loving kindness abides in this Chapter.

Ramona Chapter, No. 97. Here is a Chapter struggling for its life. It has a membership of twenty-three, twelve of whom were present at the time of my visit. Books were not in very good condition, minutes not having been written in the record book since 1894.

Bethlehem Chapter, No. 95, informed me they could not receive me at the time I was making my official visits to the other Chapters of the district. I, however, called upon the Worthy Matron of the Chapter, that I might learn something concerning it, but I am sorry indeed to report the Chapter in much the same condition as last year and the interest of the members being diverted in other directions.

SISTER PHŒBE S. MARSHALL, D. G. M.—District No. 16.

This district comprised the three Chapters in Nevada, but since my appointment as Deputy two Chapters have been instituted—Lady Emma at Wadsworth and Silver State at Winnemucca. I was present at the instituting of Lady Emma Chapter and have had the pleasure of visiting it since. I found the work well memorized and creditably rendered.

Electa Chapter, No. 120, I was unable to visit owing to the illness of the Worthy Matron, at whose request my visit was deferred until she was able to make another appointment. This has never been done.

Esther Chapter, No. 121, gave me a most cordial welcome and exemplified the work in an excellent manner. Only a very few corrections were necessary, and these were kindly received. The Secretary has no black book.

Adah Chapter, No 122. This Chapter does its work well. No ritual used except by the Chaplain. Four candidates were initiated the evening of my visit. Where all do so well it is difficult to particularize, but great credit is due the Conductress for the dignified and faultless manner in which she performed the duties of her office. Ruth's lecture also was charmingly rendered. Books are in order.

### RECOMMENDATIONS.

- I. Owing to the increase in number of Chapters I would recommend the southern portion of the State to be redistricted.
- II. Recommend the Bible be used in administering the test oath.
- III. Recommend the time for which appointments of our Grand Representatives shall hold be named by this Grand Chapter.
- IV. Considering the increasing objection to the Deputy system as now existing, I would recommend a committee be appointed by this Grand Chapter to formulate plans for the improvement of this system or the substitution of a more satisfactory and effectual method of inspecting the Chapters of this jurisdiction.
- V. Recommend that those Chapters U. D., giving evidence of competence to do the work and willingness to obey the laws and regulations of our Order, be granted charter.
- VI. Recommend that the thanks of this Grand Chapter be extended to the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of California for the invitation to the officers and members of our Order to be present on the occasion of the laying of the corner-stone of the Masonic Widows' and Orphan' Home. Expressing to him our appreciation of the courtesy and our earnest desire that the blessing of our Heavenly Father may rest upon the Masonic Fraternity in all its efforts in providing for the widowed and fatherless.

#### THE HOME.

I regret to report, as did my predecessor, that very little has been done in regard to the Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home. Several of our Chapters are gradually accumulating a Home fund which they intend to contribute toward this laudable undertaking. The corner-stone of the Home having been laid, our Order will undoubtedly be stimulated to greater activity in its behalf.

#### OUR DEAD.

During the year many of our members have passed from their earthly home "to the New Jerusalem, that city not made with hands." They have fathomed the great mystery of mysteries. The sacred tie has for the time been severed, but the sweet memory of the loved one gone will lighten our sorrow and strengthen our hopes of reunion. To the bereaved ones we would extend our sincere sympathy and recommend that a memorial page be set apart in our proceedings in honor of the departed.

### GOOD OF THE ORDER.

It is with pleasure I report the Order in this jurisdiction in a flourishing condition. With very few exceptions the officers and members of subordinate Chapters are laboring together with zeal and earnestness, satisfied with nothing short of perfection, both in ritualistic and floor work, and conducting the business affairs of the Chapters with commendable accuracy. It has been the aim of the present Grand officers to establish perfect uniformity of work throughout the jurisdiction, and it has been gratifying to note the readiness with which the officers have striven to accomplish this purpose. I have endeavored to impress upon the minds of our members the importance of being perfectly familiar with the secret work of our Order, that they might always be prepared to pass a creditable examination when visiting Chapters. To this end I have suggested that a proper examination be occasionally exemplified in open Chapter for the benefit of the members.

Three of our Chapters—Azalia, No. 77, Queen Esther, No. 71, and Sincerity, No. 53—realizing their present weakness, with heroic purpose sought to better their condition, and have

changed their place of meeting. We believe the new life and vigor thus gained will assure them a brighter future, and I am sure this Grand Chapter wishes them "God speed" in their new homes.

I have been in communication with nearly all of the Chapters in our jurisdiction and with many Grand and Past Grand Officers of other States, thereby gaining information that has greatly aided me in the discharge of my duties, and given me a knowledge of the conditions and growth of the Order in general. The letters sent out from my office will number over eight hundred. I would urge upon the officers of subordinate Chapters the importance of giving closer attention to the rules and regulations of the Order as found in the Digest; thus would the correspondence of the Grand Officers be materially lessened.

### CONCLUSION.

Sisters and Brothers: The trust with which you honored me I shall soon return to you, unsullied by any intentional wrong. The record of the year is before you, and the motive that has prompted every act has been love for our beautiful Order and an earnest desire to exalt and strengthen its conditions and increase its influence for good.

To the members of our Order who with willing hands and loving hearts have co-operated with me in my every endeavor I am sincerely grateful, and the many tokens of love and esteem received at their hands will be dearly cherished. I am especially indebted to Past Grand Matrons for valuable assistance. To our Worthy Grand Patron for counsel and advice, and to our Grand Secretary for her prompt and efficient service.

I have diligently endeavored to perform the duties of the office with credit to myself and honor to this Grand Chapter.

#### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON JURISPRUDENCE.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

Your Committee on Jurisprudence, to whom was referred that portion of the Grand Patron's address relating to the decisions made by him, respectfully recommend:

That Decision No. 1 be amended as follows, to wit:

It is the duty of every member to sign the By Laws, and willful neglect or actual refusal to do so deprives the member so refusing of all the rights and privileges of membership. But if for any reason, except for such willful neglect or actual refusal, the By-Laws have not been signed, the person initiated or affiliated is nevertheless a member, entitled to all the rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties and responsibilities of membership.

And that the same so amended be approved.

That in place of Decision No. 2 the following be adopted as a substitute, to wit:

A By-Law of a Chapter adopted previous to the time of the adoption by this Grand Chapter of the Uniform Code of By-Laws, prescribing the meetings on which initiations may be held, is valid. A By-Law of a Chapter adopted subsequent to such adoption of the Uniform Code, is null and void, it not being provided for in the Uniform Code, nor being a provision necessary to "comply with the requirements of the Ritual and the Constitution and laws of the Order."

(See substitute to Decision No. 2, page 62, Proceedings 1895.)

A motion to proceed with or to postpone an initiation is out of order, the "work" of the Chapter being under the control of the Worthy Matron, subject to the laws, rules and regulations of the Order."

A motion to change the order of business is in order, the "business" being under the control of the Chapter.

That Decision No. 3 be amended to read as follows:

"It is not the privilege of the Matron elect to select the installing officer."

The Ritual provides that "the installing officer must be a present or Past Matron or Patron. The first board of officers of a new Chapter must be installed by a Grand Matron or Patron, or a deputy; who also may install the officers of any Chapter when requested to do so by the Chapter."

That Decisions Nos. 4, 5 and 6 be approved.

That Decision No. 7 be amended as follows:

All applications for a dimit shall be construed to include a recommendatory certificate, and must be made in writing, or personally in open Chapter. Should the Chapter refuse to grant such certificate, it is optional with the party applying to retain membership in the Chapter or to take a dimit without recommendation. A member may withdraw an application for a dimit at any time before action thereon by the Chapter.

Upon the demand of a member, the Secretary shall forthwith issue a certificate of withdrawal without recommendation, but the Secretary must inform the member of the nature of the certificate to be issued.

And that the same so amended be approved.

That Decision No. 8 be not approved, but in accordance with our usual custom of seating visitors in the East, we recommend that the seat of honor for sisters of the Order be on the right of the Worthy Matron, and for brothers of the Order on the left of the Worthy Patron.

That Decision No. 9 be approved.

Your Committee on Constitution and Laws, to whom was referred that portion of the Grand Patron's address relative to a revision of the Constitution and Digest, beg leave to report that after a careful consideration of the suggestions of our Worthy Grand Patron in that behalf, we agree with him that in some matters improvement might and, no doubt, could be made in our Constitution, yet to attempt a revision of the same at this time would imperil the harmony now existing in our affairs of government, and render precedents and decisions, long concurred in, unsettled and of uncertain authority.

To revise a constitution of government of either social or political organization is hazardous in the extreme, and if the progress made by our Order in this Grand Jurisdiction, during the past twenty-five years, under our present Constitution, as brought up to date, be a fair guide for the future, we should hesitate to tamper with it now.

As to the Digest, we believe our very able and competent Committee on Jurisprudence have each year, since its compilation, supplemented it so as to keep it continually up to date, and made such corrections and amendments as to at all times render it full and complete upon all decisions made, either by the Grand Patron or Grand Chapter.

We, therefore, respectfully recommend that the recommendation of the Grand Patron that a committee of five be appointed upon revision of the Constitution and Digest, be at this time not concurred in.

Past Patron Gallup, relative to requiring members to familiarize themselves with the secret work of the Order, and that this Grand Chapter request its Representative to the General Grand Chapter to endeavor to have the work amended so that no member be permitted to participate in or allowed any of the privileges of the Order unless they be able to repeat the obligation from memory in open Chapter, respectfully beg leave to report that they have given this matter careful thought, and while they heartily approve of the sentiment which prompted the resolution, and believe that every member should be able to repeat from memory the obligation of our beautiful Order, as well as to be thoroughly familiar with all of the esoteric work, yet we are of the opinion that it would be impracticable to require such a test, for experience teaches us that it is a physical or mental impossibility for some to memorize anything, and yet the substance will be remembered and never forgotten; that many of our most devoted and conscientious members could not now and never would be able to stand such a test; then, too, it is indefinite as to when such test should be required—whether in opening or while the Chapter is in session, or immediately before a banquet, as a requirement before being allowed to participate, as one of the privileges of the Order.

Therefore, after mature deliberation, while not desiring to be understood as discountenancing the sentiment, yet believing the duties of the Worthy Patron are fully elaborated in the Constitution and Ritual, we recommend that said resolution be not adopted.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MASONIC WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' HOME.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

The Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home Committee beg leave to submit the following report.

Various plans and suggestions relating to "Home" matters have been considered by your committee during the past year, and with this brief statement this report might close, but that a recent event seems to mark an era in the history of the enterprise, for the furtherance of which, this committee was appointed and to call for some action from this Grand Chapter in regard to it. On Wednesday, October 14th, the corner-stone of the Masonic Home was laid by the Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons, with appropriate ceremonies in accordance with the usages of the Craft, in the presence of a multitude of people, many of whom were members of the Order of the Eastern Star, who were there in response to a cordial invitation from the Masonic Home Committee of the Grand Lodge to all members of our Order to be present and share the pleasures of the occasion.

The connection of our Order with the project for a Widows' and Orphans' Home is a matter of record and need not be recapitulated at this time. The sum of five hundred dollars has been paid to the Masonic Committee, as an earnest of our desire to share with them in this beneficent undertaking from its beginning. Now that the foundations are laid and the erection of the superstructure commenced, the building will be carried to completion by the Masonic Fraternity, but when it is finished much will remain to be done before it will be ready for those who are to occupy it. It seems to your committee that this is the time when the Order of the Eastern Star can most effectually co-operate with the Masonic brethren and fulfill the pledge so enthusiastically made in the session of '91, of a cordial, earnest and hearty support," by furnishing the house with what will be needed to make it in truth, as in name, a "Home." There is nearly two thousand dollars in the "Home" fund. If the Chapters in this jurisdiction will contribute a sum equal to one dollar per capita for each member borne upon the rolls of the 131 Chapters nearly nine thousand dollars will be added to the fund. Sisters, this is woman's work! Shall we pledge ourselves to it and thereby prove ourselves worthy "colaborers with the Great Brotherhood in the service of humanity."

S., by its Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home Committee, tender to the Trustees of the Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home our assistance in fitting up and furnishing the building, when completed, and that said committee be and is hereby authorized and empowered to solicit subscriptions in aid of this beneficent enterprise, and to receive, receipt for and disburse, at its discretion, all moneys now in the Home fund, or which may hereafter be paid in aid of the Home, and it shall be their duty to file with the Finance Committee of this Grand Chapter bills and vouchers for all moneys expended. To confer and act with any organization which is, or may be formed for the same purpose.

Worthy Patron Maurice Pritchard, M. D., of Sierra Star Chapter, No. 123, was excused for non-attendance at first day's session, having been detained by a patient.

Whereas, The increase of our beloved Order in this State, during fourteen years last past, has been marvelous, both in numbers and efficiency of work; and,

WHEREAS, This increase, as many of us know, has been in no small degree due to the eminent labor and faithfulness of the Worthy Grand Secretary of our Order; and,

WHEREAS, The rapid increase has been multiplying labors more than the members of this Grand Chapter are willing to see made the burden of any one individual; therefore, be it the sense of this Grand Chapter O. E. S. that the worthy and most efficient Secretary of our Grand Chapter be encouraged to provide in her labors, now becoming more and more arduous, an assistant, not only for occasional work, but for the whole year, and be it

Resolved, That it be referred to the Committee on Finance to inform this Chapter what they judge would be a suitable compensation for this annual assistant to the Worthy Grand Secretary of our Grand Chapter O. E. S.

Lawrence Button, expressed, on behalf of Oak Leaf Chapter, No. 8, regret that they could not have the opportunity of entertaining the Grand Chapter during this session, it having been the intention of that Chapter to do so, but hoped at some future session to have that privilege.

Worthy Patron W. P. Lincoln, of Ventura Chapter, No. 79, was excused from further attendance at this session, he having been called home on important business.

Wm. E. J. Baughman, Worthy Patron of Columbus Chapter, No. 117, presented the following resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Jurisprudence:

Resolved, That before each convocation of the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star, a password be issued by the Grand Patron and forwarded to the Secretary of each subordinate Chapter by the Grand Secretary. The word to be given at the door before entering.

The Worthy Grand Patron announced the appointment of the following special committees, agreeably to the recommendation of the Committee on Distribution in their report upon the address of the Worthy Grand Matron:

Committee on thanks to Trustees of Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home—Past Grand Associate Matron Mrs. Carrie A. Kingsley; Worthy Matron Mrs. Jennie Holmes, of Evangeline, No. 9; Past Matron Mrs. Mary E. Phipps, of Marysville, No. 55.

Committee on Memorial—Worthy Matron Mrs. Mary Grace Wiley, of Pasadena, No. 108; Past Matron Mrs. Lucy Barker, of San Jose, No. 31; Past Matron Mrs. Emma Malgren, of Beulah, No. 99.

Recommendations numbers one and two in the Report of the

Worthy Grand Matron were then taken up. Recommendation No. 2 was adopted. Recommendation No. 3 was adopted, and the length of time for which representatives near other Grand Chapters shall serve hereafter was made three years.

Past Patron Benj. A. Plant, of Idlewild Chapter, No. 19, chairman of the Committee on Warrants and Dispensations, presented the following report, which report was adopted:

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

Your Committee on Warrants and Dispensations have considered the work assigned to them and beg leave to report as follows:

Your committee have carefully examined such books and records of the eighteen Chapters U. D., as were submitted to it, and discover that in many instances widely divergent systems of bookkeeping are employed by Secretaries and Treasurers; that in several cases it was impossible to determine the financial condition of Chapters, notwithstanding the reports of District Deputy Grand Matrons that the books were neatly and correctly kept and in the hands of efficient officers. Eight Chapters failed to submit their by-laws books for inspection. In one instance the by-laws were signed in pencil, and in two others full names were not always given. Several Secretaries keep no account of disbursements except as scattered through their minute books, and Treasurers seem to have almost universal objection to balancing their accounts. In some Chapters the Worthy Matrons have signed the minutes of meetings as approved, while in others this has been neglected; hence your committee would recommend that in future more particular attention be paid by instituting officers and District Deputy Grand Matrons to the books and accounts of subordinate Chapters, and especially to those of Chapters U.D. We find the books and records of but one Chapter (Oakland) to be models of correctness and neatness.

Your committee have consulted the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, have examined the reports of District Deputy Grand Matrons, have listened to personal reports from representatives of fifteen Chapters U. D., and have endeavored by searching inquiry to ascertain the exact condition of each Chapter as to membership, finances, harmony, prospects for growth, Masonic support, etc., and we would recommend that charters be granted to the following Chapters, viz.: Clear Lake Chapter, Lakeport; Miramonte Chapter, Mountain View; Del Norte Chapter, Crescent City; Lyra Chapter, Whittier; Orestimba Chapter, Newman; Lodi Chapter, Lodi; Copa del Oro Chapter, Redlands; Summit Chapter, Knight's Ferry; Delano Chapter, Delano; Norwalk Chapter, Norwalk; Jasmine Chapter, Azusa; Chispa Chapter, Anaheim; Pearl Chapter, Compton. We would also recommend that the name of Lady Emma Chapter be

changed to Martha of Nevada, that being the wish of said Chapter, and that a charter be granted to it.

As to Oakland Chapter, we find it to be in a prosperous and flourishing condition, and we recommend that a charter be granted to it.

As to Mt. Shasta Chapter, the conditions spoken of in the report of the District Deputy Grand Matron of District No. 3 still continuing, we would recommend that it continue U. D. for another year.

As to Escondido Chapter, from all we can learn, sufficient earnestness and interest on the part of the members does not exist to warrant us in recommending a charter; hence we believe it should continue U. D., hoping that another year may show evidence of prosperity and zeal.

We were pained to find that Silver State Chapter had conferred the degrees upon twenty-five charter members for a sum less than that required by the constitution; hence we are obliged to recommend that no charter be granted them until such error be corrected, and that the incoming Worthy Grand Patron be authorized to issue a charter upon satisfactory evidence that the delinquent sums have been paid into the treasury.

We have considered the special dispensations granted by our Worthy Grand Matron, as shown in her address, and recommend that her action be approved.

Resolved, That it is the sense of this Grand Chapter that it is not conducive to the upbuilding of our Order and opposed to the well established rules, regulations and usages of this fraternity, that any of the so-called side degrees, or any degrees not prescribed by the Ritual of our Order, be conferred by our Chapters as such at any time, or in our Chapter rooms during the evenings of our meetings, or under the auspices or countenance of our fraternity, but that it is the sense of this Chapter that all entertainments of an exclusively social nature be reserved for a time subsequent to the close of the Chapters to the end that matters of a fraternal nature be not rendered secondary to social festivities.

Past Grand Matron Mrs. Augusta Dunn Wilson, Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence, presented the report of that committee, which was adopted without reading, members having been furnished with printed copies thereof, and the same was ordered printed with annual proceedings.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND LAWS.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S .:

Your Committee on Constitution and Laws, to whom was referred the resolution of Bro. P. P. Rowe, relative to the Book of Instructions issued during the past year for the guidance of the subordinate Chapters, in all matters pertaining to the work of the Order, beg leave to report as follows:

That we have given such time as we have had at our disposal to an examination of the said book, and from our knowledge of the same, previously obtained, we are of the opinion that although we cannot recommend its endorsement by this Grand Chapter as authoritative upon the matter therein contained, yet the principle and idea is commendable. We have found several inaccuracies, errors and innovations in the instructions, which it is unnecessary to point out in detail, but we will say that in our opinion it is better to have a unanimity of the work throughout this jurisdiction, even if erroneous, than that each Chapter should have a different method of rendering the same.

Unanimity is the great aim we strive for, and we realize that it was this idea which prompted our very efficient Worthy Grand Patron Merritt in having this work compiled and disseminated among the various Chapters, at his own expense, and his zeal for the good of the Order, and his desire that all should work under the same source of information, was only exceeded by his generosity in providing the expense of this entire undertaking from his own private purse, we feel that this Grand Chapter is under obligations to him for the principle involved and the step thus taken; and from it great results will follow which otherwise might have been retarded for years. The committee have been personally requested by our worthy Grand Patron, to recommend that the book be destroyed, for the reason that through haste in its compilation, in the desire that it might the sooner be furnished to the several Chapters, errors and omissions were made, and instructions given without due reflection and examination of the ritual and decisions of the Grand Chapter. The committee are therefore of the opinion that this course should be pursued, except in so far as the diagram is concerned, which we find to be entirely correct. That if not returned to the Grand Secretary, that they be kept only as mementoes of the zeal and fidelity for the Order of our very efficient and worthy Grand Patron, James B. Merritt, and not as authoritative in reference to the matters therein contained.

Your committee are of the opinion that such a book of instructions, carefully and correctly compiled, should be provided by this Grand Chapter, for its utility is obvious to all who have the best interests of the Order at heart, and desire the work to be uniform throughout this jurisdiction. We therefore offer the following resolution, and move its adoption:

Resolved, That the book of instructions issued and distributed to the several Chapters, during the past year, be withdrawn from use, and be no longer used for the purpose for which issued. Be it further

Resolved, That a committee of five be appointed by our Worthy Grand Patron, of whom two shall be of the Committee on Jurisprudence, who shall, as soon as possible, compile and have printed, a uniform work of instructions, containing the diagram, one copy of which shall be furnished to each Chapter for its guidance in rendering the work in this jurisdiction. That the sum of \$50.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated for that purpose.

#### AMENDMENT

TO THE

#### CONSTITUTION OF THE GRAND CHAPTER:

#### ANNUAL RETURNS.

Each chartered Chapter shall transmit to the Grand Secretary a full and correct report of its transactions for the twelve months next proceeding the 31st of July in each year, within thirty days thereafter, in such form as may be provided. This report shall include the names, in full, of its officers. Past Matrons, Past Patrons and members, the number and names of members initiated, affiliated, reinstated, dimitted, suspended. expelled, or died, and the amount due to the Grand Chapter. Said amount must accompany the report; and each Chapter U. D. shall transmit a similar return from the date of its organization to the end of the fiscal year (the 31st day of July); and no Chapter under a dispensation granted subsequent to the said date and prior to the next meeting of the Grand Chapter, shall be required to pay dues to the Grand Chapter for that year. Chapters instituted during the first six months of the fiscal year shall pay the full amount of the Grand Chapter dues, and Chapters instituted during the last six months of the fiscal year shall pay one-half of the Grand Chapter dues for membership, but the full amount for every member admitted.

All Chapters failing to have their returns in the Grand Secretary's office September 1st, shall by that act become delinquent.

# ARKANSAS.






