The Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star of the State of California convened in Twenty-seventh Annual Session in Sherman & Clay Hall, 223 Sutter street, in the City of San Francisco, on Tuesday the seventeenth day of October, A. D. 1899, at I o'clock P. M. Past Grand Patron Harrison "D" Rowe in the chair of the presiding officer, called the members to order, and called them up to receive the Grand Officers as they entered the hall preceded by the Grand Marshal. The Grand Officers assuming their respective stations, Past Grand Patron Rowe presented the gavel to Joseph Martin Lawrance, Worthy Grand Patron, who upon receiving the gavel, seated the members and requested the Grand Secretary to call the roll of Chapters, which being done, it was found that a quorum of Chapters was represented, whereupon the Grand Chapter was called on by the Worthy Grand Patron, and was opened in Ample Form, when after the singing of an ode and the offering of prayer by the Grand Chaplain, by direction of the Worthy Grand Patron, the Grand

Marshal proclaimed the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star for the State of California opened in Twenty-seventh Annual Session.

And the representatives of 126 chartered Chapters and of 10 Chapters under dispensation, with many Past Matrons and Past Patrons entitled to seats.

Reading of the proceedings of the last annual session was dispensed with, members having been furnished with printed copies thereof.

APPOINTMENT.

To fill vacancy caused by absence of officer, the Worthy Grand Matron, Maria Akers Pierce, made the following appointment, *Grand Esther*, Annie Marie Johnson, Worthy Matron of Harmony Chapter, No. 124.

The Worthy Grand Patron, Joseph Martin Lawrance, then read to the Grand Chapter his Annual Address, as follows:

ADDRESS OF THE WORTHY GRAND PATRON.

Sisters and Brothers of the Grand Chapter:

Once again the gavel has sounded, calling together the members of the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star. From near and from far, from mountain and from low-land, you have laid aside the varied duties of life in response to this summons and are now gathered together to do what may lie in your power to further the best interests of this Grand Order, the "Order of the Eastern Star."

You have come with loyal hearts to review the work of the past year, to separate the wheat from the chaff, to hold fast to all that is good and helpful, to give up that which may have proven harmful, and to revise whatever rules and regulations it may seem necessary, in order that the coming year may be still more prosperous.

The eyes of many members in their homes are turned toward this gathering; willing and anxious hearts are waiting to co-operate and help in carrying out the wishes and wise rulings of this Grand Chapter. May grace be given us to do our work well; may we be able to cement more firmly the ties which bind us to each other and to our beloved Order; may the good influences arising from this gathering be carried back to our homes and serve as a cord to bind the Subordinate Chapters together and keep them from drifting, one from another; and in each heart may there spring up new love and loyalty for our Masonic life.

It is with the warmth of tender memories of the past that I welcome all who have in previous years come up to this annual convocation of our Order, consecrated to the noble work of Love, Relief and Truth; and with equal pleasure I greet the accession

to our numbers of those who now, for the first time join us, in what to them will be new associations and responsibilities. as we deliberate let us give our best thought, our most careful attention and our best judgment to all questions that may be brought forward for our consideration. Let us not hesitate to freely and conscientiously give expression to our opinions and conclusions, yet at all times be prepared to attach due weight and importance to the suggestions of others, remembering that the field of individual observation is so limited that much may escape us which is necessary to be taken into account in arriving at correct conclusions or judgments. Let the central animating thought, manly, robust and generous, permeating all our words and acts, be love for our Order. To all who are members of the Eastern Star the Order is very dear; and it has a right to our love and pride. It has sought to protect the weak, to save the erring, to raise the unfortunate. Founded as it is on the underlying principles of the Golden Rule, there is no reason why, as years roll on, the Masonic Fraternity may not regard the Eastern Star as the brightest Star in the galaxy of Masonry, and deem it an honor and a privilege to have the names of their wives and daughters inscribed upon its roll. The first step towards this result is pride in our Order, simple, honest, frank and ever If we have this pride and faith we shall appreciate our responsibilities and bring the standard of our work up to a higher plane.

In accordance with the time-honored custom, I will briefly render to you an account of my official acts, acts in which you are interested. One year ago you invested me with the insignia of this office, and with fear and trembling I entered into the performance of the duties it involved. To-day I render the account; it is for you to judge whether I may have, in some small degree, proven worthy of the trust and confidence you reposed in me.

After appointing the regular standing committees for the year, as required by our regulations, I appointed a Special Committee to make an inventory of all property, supplies and paraphernalia belonging to the Grand Chapter; and to list the same in a book suitably arranged, showing under proper headings the amounts on hand, additions made thereto, by purchase or otherwise, de-

ductions from the same by reason of sale, gift or use, to the end that we may have a Stock Book of the Grand Chapter. This book to be kept by the Grand Treasurer, and she to report to the Grand Chapter, in addition to her Financial Report as required by the Constitution, the amount and condition of supplies on hand, with recommendations as to supplies needed. This has been done. Our Grand Treasurer's Report this year will, for the first time, show the amount of supplies and paraphernalia owned by this Grand Chapter.

October 31st — Authorized Iphigenia Chapter, U. D., at Eureka, Nevada, to continue under dispensation until this session of the Grand Chapter.

November 9, 1898—Authorized Past Grand Patron Harrison "D" Rowe to install the first officers of Onisbo Chapter, No. 164, at Courtland, Cal., and also of Gold Ridge Chapter, No. 161, at Sebastopol, Cal.

November 10, 1898—Authorized Past Worthy Matron Agnes M. Morgans to install the first officers of Crescent Chapter, No. 165, at Murphys, Cal.

November 10, 1898—Authorized Associate Grand Patron George L. Darling to install the first officers of Penrhyn Chapter, No. 159, at Penryn, Cal.

November 18, 1898—Authorized Past Grand Matron Carrie L. Peaslee to install the first officers of Crown Chapter, No. 162, at Corona, Cal.

December 20, 1898—It was a pleasure enjoyed by myself to install the first officers of Scepter Chapter, No. 163, at Orange, Cal. Also

December 29, 1898—the first officers of Occident Chapter, No. 160, at Downey, Cal.

These two dates recall pleasant recollections to me and they mark an important event in the history of those Chapters.

In addition to these duties which are required to be performed by a Present or Past Grand Officer, I had the honor of installing the officers of several Chapters in the southern part of this Jurisdiction, in each instance the occasion being truly enjoyable.

November 19, 1898—Acacia Chapter, No. 21, my home Chapter, tendered a reception to me, as Worthy Grand Patron. This

was largely attended, my enjoyment being enhanced by the presence of many members from South Gate, Pasadena and other contiguous Chapters. The memory of the warm hand-clasp and the kind word spoken on that occasion made a deep impression and inspired me to renewed efforts in the promulgation of truth and love, unity and peace. A kind word often carries a flood of sunshine with it, and hand clasped by hand speaks a language of its own to the troubled heart; and my term of office has not been free from anxieties and an ominous weight of responsibilities.

Last year the report of the Committee on Constitution and Laws in relation to the revision of the Constitution in reference to providing for expense of trials in Subordinate Chapters, together with the Recommendations of Grand Patron, H. D. Rowe, were referred for further consideration to a Special Committee of Three, to be appointed by the incoming Grand Patron. In compliance with this action taken by the Grand Chapter at its last session, I appointed as such Special Committee Past Grand Patron, Jacob F. Boller, Chairman of the Committee on Constitution and Laws; Past Grand Matron, Abbie E. Krebs, and Past Matron, Nellie B. Cory—they to take up the entire matter and report to the Grand Chapter such changes as they deem necessary to make in our Constitution in order to protect us from being chargeable for costs of trials in Subordinate Chapters.

December 6, 1898—Received and approved the bond of the Grand Secretary to the amount of three thousand dollars, in Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland, and of the Grand Treasurer to the amount of six thousand dollars in the same Company, the premium being ten per cent. less than one-half of one per cent. In my opinion this is the best possible security we can have, and at a minimum cost. Being paid by the Grand Chapter, it relieves our officers from personal solicitation of members to endorse bonds in which they have no personal interest and over which they have no control.

NEW CHAPTERS INSTITUTED.

During the year there have been nine new Chapters formed in this Grand Jurisdiction, adding nine new Stars to our Constellation. Each appears to be occupying a fruitful field and enjoying a healthy growth, and thus bids fair to become an honor to our noble Order.

The first to be instituted is named "Esperanza," which being translated signifies "Hope." To me this seems an appropriate name, for I fancy the bright angel, Hope, watches over this Chapter, and with rosy fingers paints their future in bright colors.

This Chapter was instituted in South Gate Hall, February 11, 1899, with thirteen members, your Grand Patron having the assistance of the officers of South Gate Chapter, No. 133, on that occasion. Ever since the members of this Chapter have shown great interest in Esperanza and have held themselves ever ready to extend to them every courtesy and to render every possible assistance.

Right here, I must say that a most friendly feeling exists among all the Chapters in Los Angeles and vicinity, Chapters frequently being invited to visit one another and exemplify the work, after which they are royally entertained.

The second Chapter to be instituted in this Jurisdiction is named "Los Angeles"; and what name could be more appropriate—the name of the city par excellent—the city beloved by all who have had the pleasure of visiting it, and much more so by those who dwell therein.

"Our City of the Angels lies beneath

The bending Heaven that hides these realms of light,
Her Angels to a work-day world belong,
And wage on earth the battle for the right.

And yet a Heavenly Paradise she seems,
Amidst the orange groves and flowers;
Half veiled, in dreamy light of sunny skies;
Half hid beneath her gorgeous southern bowers.

Long in calm, unconscious grace she slept,
Until the Angel's Spirit came—
The touch divine, that raises man on high—
And crowned her with the Angel name."

Los Angeles Chapter was instituted February 14, 1899, in the Hall of Acacia Chapter, No. 21, your Grand Patron having the assistance of the officers of Acacia Chapter; and ever since this

Chapter has delighted to call itself "Godmother" to this new Chapter. On their dispensation they have the names of some of the best and most influential members of the Masonic Order in Los Angeles, and they cannot help but have a steady and healthful growth. These two Chapters are often alluded to as the "Twins."

I issued a warrant to Associate Grand Patron, George L. Darling, to institute Olive Branch and Century Chapters at San Francisco, and from information furnished by him I am enabled to give the following account:

Olive Branch Chapter was instituted in Shasta Hall, Native Sons' Building, San Francisco, on the evening of March 29, 1899, by Associate Grand Patron, Brother George L. Darling, assisted by Worthy Grand Matron Sister Maria A. Pierce, Past Most Worthy Grand Matron Mary E. Partridge, Past Worthy Grand Matron Augusta D. Wilson, Grand Secretary Kate J. Willats, and others from neighboring Chapters.

This Chapter started its career with a membership of seventeen, and from their number Sister Charlotte E. Marais was chosen Worthy Matron; Brother Charles L. P. Marais, Worthy Patron; and Sister Melissa G. McConkey, Associate Matron. Many and hearty were the expressions of good will and encouragement uttered by Sisters Pierce, Partridge, Willats and Wilson, and by Brothers Darling, Young, and Dr. Smith; it was a truly enjoyable evening. This Chapter is showing satisfactory growth, and a laudable ambition to become an honor to our Order.

Only a few days later, April 4th, a Chapter was instituted in Franklin Hall, San Francisco, known as Century Chapter. On this occasion Associate Grand Patron Brother George L. Darling was ably assisted by Worthy Grand Matron Sister Maria A. Pierce, and others. The warrant for instituting a new Chapter was read by Grand Secretary Kate J. Willats, after which a Chapter was opened in regular form by the aid of members of the Order then present; the initiatory ceremony was exemplified and officers were chosen to serve this new Chapter while working under a dispensation.

The choice fell upon Sister Martha E. Blade as Worthy Matron, Brother Arthur M. Blade as Worthy Patron, Sister N. Annette

Wood as Associate Matron. The dispensation was delivered into their keeping and they were declared regularly instituted. Present and Past Grand Officers and others vied with one another in their expressions of encouragement and wishes for prosperity. This Chapter is now an accomplished fact, and none rejoice more heartily in its bright prospects and its expected success than my-self.

May 12, 1899—In Masonic Hall at Redondo, Carnation Chapter was instituted, I having the assistance of Past Associate Grand Matron, Hattie E. Alexander, and other members of the . Order. This Chapter is located at one of our seaside resorts in a somewhat limited field, a part of the members residing at quite a distance; yet here is to be found quite a good lodge of Free and Accepted Masons, who take an interest in the Eastern Star. The officers of Carnation Chapter exhibit great interest and are well up in the work, paying frequent visits to Los Angeles Chapters for the sake of the fraternal spirit and to gain inspiration and proficiency.

July 18, 1899—Lexington Chapter, at El Monte, with thirteen members was instituted by me, with the assistance of Past Associate Grand Matron Hattie E. Alexander, and other members of the Order. I have hopes that this Chapter will infuse new life into Lexington Lodge, No. 104, F. & A. M., one of the oldest in the South, having been established in 1856, and much of the Lodge room paraphernalia now in use having been shipped around the Horn in sailing vessels. Of late years this Lodge has made but little advancement; their most active members are now instrumental in the founding of this new Chapter, and they hope that both will grow, one supporting the other. Fifty ladies eligible to the degrees can be counted up in this section.

August 7, 1899—Assisted by Past Associate Grand Matron Hattie E. Alexander, I instituted Long Beach Chapter at Long Beach, with a membership of thirteen. Great interest being manifested, and doubtless there will be no dearth of applications for membership.

August 18, 1899-At Fraternity Hall, in San Pedro, Harbor

Chapter was instituted, with a membership of seventeen, I having the assistance of Sister Hattie E. Alexander, Past Associate Grand Matron, and other members of the Order from Los Angeles.

Several more wanted to come in as charter members, but according to a previous ruling seventeen had been considered the limit, so they had to give way. Doubtless as soon as this Chapter is prepared to confer the degrees their number will increase. The Matron and Patron have been in the Order before, and will soon place this Chapter on a good working basis.

Harbor Chapter and Long Beach Chapter are within driving distance, and they anticipate much pleasure and profit in the interchange of fraternal visits that they have promised themselves. A party of ladies came over from Long Beach Chapter to witness the instituting of this Sister Chapter and to extend to them a word of greeting.

The last Chapter to be instituted in this Grand Jurisdiction was at Sissons, on Saturday evening, the 23d day of September. This was instituted by our Worthy Grand Matron Maria A. Pierce, assisted by Past Grand Patron J. R. Tapscott, Grand Secretary Kate J. Willats, Grand Treasurer Kate S. Craig, Past Grand Matron Ella T. Hall, and others. Sisson Chapter was duly instituted under dispensation under the most favorable auspices, the members exhibiting evidence of being qualified to make efficient officers and conscientious members. Many and hearty were the expressions of hope and encouragement by the visitors It is seldom that a new Chapter is launched with so much assurance of success. I desire to thank our Grand Officers, Worthy Grand Matron Maria A. Pierce, Grand Secretary Kate J. Willats, Grand Treasurer Kate S. Craig, Past Grand Patron J. P. Tapscott, and Past Grand Matron Ella T. Hall, for so successfully and acceptably accomplishing this work for our beloved Order. This makes the ninth and last Chapter instituted during the year. I very much hope they will all grow in numbers and Let us as a Grand Chapter do all we can to help them; recognize them as members of the great family of our Order.

DECISIONS.

No. 1.—Any eligible member may be elected to office whether present at time of election or not.

No. 2.—Secretaries must read the minutes of the previous meeting in open Chapter so that members may note errors or omissions. If found to be correct as read, the Matron shall declare them approved, provided, that a Chapter may for reasons satisfactory to itself postpone the reading of such minutes until a subsequent meeting.

The Worthy Matron cannot request or allow the omission from the minutes of the proceedings or any part thereof, without the vote of the Chapter.

- No. 3.—Dispensations received by a Chapter from the Worthy Grand Matron, for any purpose, must be read aloud in open Chapter, that all may have due notice. See also decision No. 447 of Digest of 1898.
- No. 4.—A candidate elected to receive the degrees by a Chapter in another Grand Jurisdiction, before degrees are conferred candidate removes to California, bringing a request from the Chapter where elected, to a Chapter in this State, to confer the degrees for them; which request is complied with. Which By-Laws should the initiate sign, the Chapter electing or the Chapter conferring the degrees? Answer: The By-Laws of the Chapter who elected the candidate.
- No. 5.—A woman divorced from her husband who was a Master Mason cannot receive the degrees of the Order by reason of her relationship to him.
- No. 6.—Any one of the following persons is qualified to become the installing officer of a Chapter, to wit: a present or past Matron or Patron, or a present or past Grand Matron or Grand Patron, which one of whom shall so act to be determined by the Chapter.

The first board of officers of a new Chapter must be installed by the Grand Patron or a Deputy duly authorized and empowered by him therefor, which Deputy must be a present or past Matron or Patron, the Grand Matron or a past Grand Matron or past Grand Patron. (See Ritual, page 69; also decisions 12 and 19 of Digest.)

No. 7.—When a dimit is presented and dues paid as a contributing member, the Matron should announce the contribution in open Chapter, and that the same would be received if there be

no objection. No ballot need be taken unless requested; but, if taken, the vote should be by paper ballot, the ballot box not being suited to the taking of a majority vote.

No. 8.—No one whose petition for the degrees has been rejected is qualified to sign a petition to have the degrees conferred at sight, or petition for dispensation to institute a new Chapter until after six months from date of rejection by Chapter.

No. 9.—Can a Chapter act upon the petition for the degrees of any one who is visiting within its jurisdiction from another State by getting consent of the Chapter within whose jurisdiction the petitioner's home is situated? Answer: No one can have a home in more than one place at the same time. Six months' residence, together with a declared intention of making the new location the home, is necessary before petition can be received.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

No. 1.—In recognition of the fact that great interest is manifested by the members in this Grand Chapter, many having come hundreds of miles in order to be present and participate in its deliberations, we should be firmly convinced of its utility. We declare our purpose to be the promotion of Truth and Love, Unity and Peace. All our acts, as well as our declarations, go to show that we believe we have a mission to perform; that we love our noble Order for the good it has done and is doing in stilling the cry of the orphan, responding to the call of want, and sympathizing with those who are bowed down with sorrow. All this and more being our aim and object, we should strive to increase our membership and the number of our Chapters. Indeed, it is the opinion of many of our brightest and best members that a Chapter of our Order should exist and be self-supporting wherever a lodge of Free and Accepted Masons flourishes. this is admitted, it necessarily follows that we should do all we can to encourage and foster new Chapters; at least, impose no hardships upon them.

During the past year my attention has been forcibly directed to the efforts made by new Chapters to maintain an existence, and after witnessing the struggles of the innocent infants, and giving the matter some attention, I recommend that this Grand Chapter take some step looking toward the alleviation of the burdens of a new Chapter. And would therefore suggest that Section 18 of Article I be so amended that the last two lines on page 11 do not apply to Chapters under dispensation.

No. 2.—I recommend that decision No. 208 of the Digest be annulled and a new decision adopted that will be more comprehensive and more in conformity with our Book of Instruction. I would therefore suggest the following: If the majority of the Committee of Investigation on a petition for the degrees report favorable, the petition may be balloted upon, even if not signed by the full Committee, providing that the Brother of the Investigating Committee makes one of the majority. A report of the Committee of Investigation on a petition for affiliation, favorably signed by any two of the members, would be sufficient for balloting. For an affiliate it is not necessary that the Brother should report, as the applicant is already a member of the Order; but on the petition for the degrees the Brother must make a favorable report.

No. 3.—I recommend that action be taken at this session of the Grand Chapter concerning the preparation of the ballot box, and that the relative proportion of cubes to white balls be clearly defined. It has been reported that members have provided themselves with cubes before entering the Chapter Room, and that after a ballot had been taken there were found to be more cubes in the box than were there before the ballot, thus clearly showing that cubes had been provided in advance for fear that they would not be conveniently found for use when required; and delay in voting, caused by searching for a cube, would reveal the party casting the rejecting vote. This would not be likely to occur provided there were a greater number of cubes in the ballot box. I would suggest that the ballot box be considered not properly prepared unless it have at least five cubes for every fifty white balls and fraction thereof.

No. 4.—I recommend that action be taken requiring the Grand Treasurer elect, in addition to her duties as prescribed by our Constitution, to keep the Stock Book of the Grand Chapter, in which entries are to be made showing kinds and amounts of all

property, supplies, and paraphernalia belonging to the Grand Chapter; the additions made thereto by purchase, gift or otherwise, the deductions therefrom by reason of use, sale or donation. That the Grand Secretary be required to furnish the Grand Treasurer on the first of each month an itemized account of all purchases, gifts, sales, donations, etc. This data to be used by the Grand Treasurer in making up her Stock Book, and to be kept on file until the end of the year, when in connection with the Stock Book and Grand Treasurer's Report, it is to be turned over to her successor in office. At the end of the year the Grand Treasurer make a written report to the Grand Chapter, not only of the amount of all stock and paraphernalia on hand, but in addition thereto such recommendations as to amounts required during the ensuing year as is deemed necessary. When systematized, this will require but little additional work on the part of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer, and I believe it would be of great value to the Grand Chapter.

No. 5.—I recommend that the Committee on Printing hereafter have a written agreement with and bonds for a suitable amount furnished by the printer to the effect that the Proceedings of the Grand Chapter shall be delivered complete to the Grand Secretary within thirty days from the date of receipt thereof; also, that the Grand Secretary have the manuscript in the printer's hands within thirty days from the close of the Grand Chapter. We have apparently been very slow in the issuing of our Proceedings, much to the annovance of Subordinate Chapters. I received my copy of the Proceedings of the last Grand Chapter on February 6th, just 108 days after its close. It appears to me that much of the matter contained in the book of Proceedings could be prepared in advance of the session of the Grand Chapter. I do not wish to unduly hasten our Grand Secretary, but let this matter be governed by the same business rules that we apply to other matters.

No. 6.—I recommend that the Grand Chapter for another year continue in force the resolution adopted by the last Grand Chapter to take the place of Section 19, Article I, of our Constitution, which was suspended and rendered inoperative for one year. I hold that the visits of our Worthy Grand Matron to the centers of population of each district and the schools of instruction held

there by her have been a grand success, and that at no time in the history of our existence has the interpretation of our work been so uniform and so much unity of purpose exhibited throughout the Jurisdiction. The manner in which these schools of instruction have been conducted by our Worthy Grand Matron has been entirely acceptable to the Subordinate Chapters, and they have done much to strengthen and unite the Chapters of the Districts, and thus the whole organization has been strengthened and improved. I feel that we should have a Grand Lecturess. Whether it is expedient for our Worthy Grand Matron to assume this work or to have it done by some competent member, I leave you to judge.

No. 7.—The 31st day of August has been set apart by the General Grand Chapter of the United States as our "Natal Day." This day, being the birthday of Robert Morris, the father and founder of the Order of the Eastern Star, has well been selected as our "Natal Day." I would therefore recommend that every year each Chapter at its last meeting in August or its first meeting in September take some fitting recognition of this date and in some appropriate way observe this our "Natal Day"; and suggest that the Printing Committee of this Grand Chapter be authorized to have printed a sufficient number of copies of the ritualistic ceremonies as compiled and arranged by Sister H. Augusta Hobe of Golden Gate Chapter, No. 1, and as exemplified during session of the Grand Chapter, namely, on evening of October 17, 1888, and that a suitable number of copies of same be sent to the Worthy Matron of each Chapter in this Jurisdiction, to be used by them in whole or in part as they, may determine, in recognition of the "Natal Day" of our Order.

No. 8.—A step-daughter, under our California Code, has the same legal standing, when accepted as such by the father, as children of the whole blood, and inherit the same. Why should we not hold them in the same category and permit them to join without formal legal adoption? I would recommend that our Constitution be so amended that where daughters have been adopted to all intents and purposes and have same name as step-father that they be eligible, when of proper age, same as if legally adopted.

MASONIC WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' HOME.

As you know, the Eastern Star have taken upon themselves the furnishing of the Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home at Decoto, and at our last session the committee appointed to take charge of this matter reported to the Grand Chapter that the money collected for this purpose, together with what had been promised, amounted to about \$4,500. It is to be hoped that at this session the committee will be able to report that our labors in this direction have been completed. It is a cause that justifies our most earnest efforts, and the accomplishment will add new luster to our name. Commendable as has been this action on the part of this Grand Chapter in accomplishing this self-imposed task, there is yet a work to be performed by the Order of the Eastern Star.

The widows and orphans have a home at Decoto where they may, with the aged Masonic Brother, find shelter and comforts in their distress, but there is no home for the Master Mason's mother or sister; these are denied admission, as such, to this home at Decoto. Since this is true, this Grand Chapter at this session should recognize the necessity of building an Eastern Star Home, where the wives, mothers, daughters, and sisters of Master Masons may find a refuge. I earnestly recommend that we at once begin this work and carry it forward to a speedy culmination. I believe our Order will gladly avail themselves of this opportunity to contribute toward this noble charity. It may not be inopportune, at this time, to say that members of our Order in the southern part of the Jurisdiction are positive in their conviction that this Home should be built. Let us move in this matter at once, and thereby show our Masonic Brothers that we as an Order are working on lines parallel with them.

TO THE DEPARTED.

During the past year the stern and unrelenting hand of the Great Reaper has visited many of the Chapters throughout this Jurisdiction, and in answer to his touch one or more links from the Golden Chain have been severed. They have been called upon to perform the last sad rites which affection prescribes for one of their number, and with tender and sympathizing hearts

they fulfilled the trust. With solemn and measured tread, with moistened eye and quivering lips, they gently and reverently drop the acacia into the final resting-place of the pale and dreamless sleeper. It is but fitting that we now pause in our deliberations and extend the look of sympathy, and give the word of comfort and of hope. "They are not dead; they do but sleep." With the ebbing tide their spirits passed through the dark portal called Death and winged their flight to a new and higher existence, to which we will soon be called upon to follow. By their acts they engraved their names in their Chapter's history; by the soft reflection of their kind deeds and loving hearts a tender glow is thrown over their memories and the music of their voices still vibrates in their Chapter halls and speaks most eloquently of the one gone on before, for "all is not lost with the breath." In that unknown realm from which the traveler ne'er returns the mystic light radiated from the Star we follow will shine o'er them unbroken and forever. "Peace to their ashes."

This Grand Chapter has been called upon to give from out its number. Our first Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Maria Anderson, has laid aside her armor, and now sleeps the sleep that knows no waking. Our Past Treasurer, Sister Mary Anna Smith, left us on the 8th of April last, no more to walk with us in our daily life. Their life's labors are ended and I trust are now stamped with the seal "Well done." I have asked Brother George John Hobe, the first Worthy Grand Patron of California, who is still with us, to write a few lines in memory of Maria Anderson, the first Worthy Grand Matron of California, and his co-laborer during the first year of this Grand Chapter's existence, and to the united efforts of whom we owe a debt of gratitude. Brother Hobe replies as follows, by the hand of his wife, our Sister H. Augusta Hobe:

Sister Maria Anderson was born February 3, 1821. She received the degrees of the Order of the Eastern Star by communication on April 23, 1869. At that time she was the wife of Brother James Everard, an actor by profession. As an actress Sister Everard had acquired an education in early life which qualified her to become an efficient instructor in the new Order, and on account of her public experience she was considered to

be better fitted than any other Sister to make the enterprise a success, and yet she had no easy task. "Separated by thousands of miles from any other Chapter of the Order, without the advice or assistance of any one capable of instructing the members in the work or ceremonies of a Chapter; surrounded by influences which, if not positively antagonistic, were nevertheless injurious to the prosperity of the Order, it required a hard struggle against difficulties and opposition" to manipulate the crude material into proper form; but Sister Everard proved to be an able assistant to the devoted little band of zealous workers, who had raised our standard colors on this far-off western shore, and their united labor of love reached its fruition on the 23d day of August, 1869, when the first Eastern Star Chapter on this Coast was opened in regular form for the transaction of legitimate business, with Sister Everard in the Chair. Previous to this date 58 had received the degrees by communication. In less than four months afterward 35 members were regularly initiated. December 27, 1869, Sister Everard had the honor of being first elected and installed Worthy Matron in this State. At the close of her year's service, in December, 1870, she had received 120 petitions and initiated 103 members; 10 others came into the Chapter later on, making a record unsurpassed in the annals of the Order in California. When she retired from office she received the collar and jewel of a Past Worthy Matron and also a handsome case of silver, but she cherished most, as a precious memento of the past, the practical proof that she was loved and honored by the members of her beloved Chapter, for when death invaded her happy home in June, 1871, and she was left without kindred, alone in her widowhood, the Chapter members were called together to show their sympathy for her bereavement-The Worthy Patron escorted the Sisters in a body from their Chapter Hall on Post street to the Masonic Temple, where seats had been reserved for them, which was at that time a great innovation. At the Masonic Cemetery, when Mount Moriah Lodge, No. 44, F. & A. M., had finished the sad fraternal rites for their Master, Brother James Everard, they stepped aside, and the Sisters of the Order of the Eastern Star gathered around the weeping widow with kind words of love and tenderness, and while quietly covering the mound which contained the mortal remains of her loved one with their floral offerings, "instilled hope into her heart until she looked beyond the river and saw the glory of the farther shore." March 10, 1872, Sister Everard was duly installed Worthy Matron of Alameda Chapter, No. 7, and from her saddened home she continued to work for the interests of the Order of the Eastern Star.

Some time after she married the genial L. C. Anderson, a brother actor and an old-time friend of her late husband. April 7, 1873, when the delegates from the several Chapters of the Order Eastern Star in this State met to organize a Grand Chapter, Sister Anderson received her reward as the *Pioneer Sister Worker* in the Order by being elected and installed the first Worthy Grand Matron of California. She occupied her seat of honor at the first Annual Communication of the Grand Chapter October 15, 1873. The Body then represented nine Subordinate Chapters, and a membership of over 500, as a result of the nucleus formed by fourteen Order Eastern Star members April 8, 1869.

April 23, 1877, Brother and Sister Anderson affiliated with the Parent Chapter and their membership was retained until Death severed the Golden Chain. Sister Anderson buried her second husband about 1885, but while she continued to reside in New York City she never lost her affection for the Order Eastern Star in this State. She was also very much interested in the Masonic Home and wrote to the Grand Secretary, Sister Willats, February 23, 1898, thanking her for some Home information, which she had sent to her by request. Sister Anderson was a true woman, faithful in all her relations of life, and an honor to the Order she helped to establish and love. Bereft, aged and alone, she has seemed to say to her friends: "I am

"Only waiting until the shadows are a little longer grown,
Only waiting, till the glimmer of the day's last gleam has flown,
Then from out the folded darkness, Holy Deathless Star shall rise,
By whose light my soul will gladly wing her passage to the skies."

I suggest that this beautiful tribute be preserved to our Order by having it printed on the page opposite the one set apart to the memory of our loved and honored Sister Anderson, and that this Grand Chapter express to our Sister H. Augusta Hobe and her husband, our Brother Past Grand Patron George John Hobe, our appreciation of the loving tribute so eloquently expressed, recounting the love and loyalty of our Sister Maria Anderson, the first Worthy Grand Matron Order Eastern Star of California.

I also requested Sister Ada R. Duncan, Worthy Matron of Golden Gate Chapter, No. 1, Order Eastern Star, to name a committee to write a suitable eulogy upon the life and services of Sister Mary A. Smith, Past Grand Treasurer of the Grand Chapter, who was called to a higher existence April 8, 1899.

In compliance with this request, I present the following beautiful tribute, written by Brother William S. Moses, who is recognized as the Father of the Order of the Eastern Star, in California, and who is still an honored member of Golden Gate Chapter, No. 1, which he instituted over thirty years ago, and the first Chapter on the Pacific Coast.

WORDS SPOKEN OF THE DEAD.

The dead leave behind their memory, their example and all the effects of their actions; their influence still abides with us; we enjoy the benefits of their labors. Our institutions have been founded by them, our minds have been formed by their instructions; those we have loved in life are still objects of our holiest affections. They are with us in our daily walks, and their voices speak to our hearts in the silence of the night. We are separated from them but for a little time. We are soon to be united with them. Our affections are not buried in the grave, to which we have committed their poor remains. We will cherish our love for them while on earth, and hope to meet them some time and some where hereafter.

There is not one of us that have not at some time in our lives parted forever from our dearest friend, who had been called home before us. Why—we could not tell. If it were in the joy and gladness of their youth, the meridian of their usefulness in working out the aim of life allotted them, or nearing the end of a long life of usefulness spent in labors of love and charity for all. Their actions we cannot forget. The beautiful mirror of memory, ever

faithful, will always bring their forms, features and voices before us, and we seem for a time once again in their presence. Our every perception is gently swayed by a sweet dream of the past, that appeals to all that is good within us, that calls before us all that was good in our departed friends, and we rejoice that it was our privilege to have known them.

The feelings and sentiment of the members of Golden Gate Chapter for our dear friend and sister we would fain express in language more fitting than we are able to command. Yet all we might say or write would express but little, for our regard for her virtues and good deeds cannot be measured by words. The adornments of rhetoric could add nothing to our pleasant remembrance of her, or the plaudits and adulation of the multitude, a single sentiment of love and affection that we were strangers to, and have not always felt for her, those who have known her longest and best are ever ready to say she was fairest.

Sister Mary A. Smith was among the oldest members of our Chapter. On January 31, 1870, she became a member by initiation, receiving that mystic light and knowledge that became the rule of her life, and that was outwardly exemplified in her acts of kindness and good works for all with whom she was associated.

She served the Chapter as Warder in 1872, and in 1879 was chosen to the highest office in our gift, our Worthy Matron, in which office she merited and received the respect and assistance of the officers associated with her, and the fraternal regard and obedience of the members. Her practice of life and earnest labors for the welfare of the Order of the Eastern Star was rewarded by the Grand Chapter of California, in electing her its Grand Treasurer in 1891. She remained a member of our Chapter for over thirty years, and was called home by Divine command April 8, 1899, at the age of sixty-eight years.

I also recommend that this tribute of love and affection be preserved to our Order by having it printed in our Proceedings on page opposite the one set apart to the memory of Sister Mary A. Smith, Past Grand Treasurer, not only as a loving tribute to our absent Sister, but also as the expression of our

much beloved Brother, William S. Moses, whom we all love and honor for his early and continued devotion to the Order of the Eastern Star, in first unfurling our banner on this Coast, and of whom it can be said, "And lo, the Star which they saw in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was."

CONCLUSION.

The year is fast rolling into the abyss of the past, and if we would we could not stay its progress. A few days hence and the labors of the 27th Convocation of the Grand Chapter of California will have passed into history. Grant that our deliberations may be characterized by Truth, Knowledge, Ability and Experience, and that Peace and Good-will may shed a parting benediction o'er us.

Soon will I pass the emblem of authority entrusted to me into the keeping of other and more competent, yet not more willing, hands; but the pleasant memories, the dear associations and the warm friendships of the past year are mine to preserve and cherish until my latest breath.

What ought I now to say to encourage, to strengthen, and to cheer you? What can I do to further inspire you with my anxiety for the unbounded success and steady onward progress of the Order of the Eastern Star? Need I try to do more to strengthen the fraternal bond, even now so enduring that neither life nor death can sever the Golden Chain?

As the years pass by, the eye becomes dim, the mind less retentive, the step less elastic; yet in the flickering twilight and around the dying embers of our earthly life the lessons taught in our Chapter Room will shine forth with more vivid lustre and clearer meaning, to sweeten and fortify us for the last great change ere we join that Celestial Chapter where all is Love and Peace.

Being separated by many miles from the Central and Northern part of this Jurisdiction, and owing to my professional duties and the urgency of unfinished business, I have been unable to visit any Chapter except those in the Southern part of the State. I have had to depend upon our Worthy Grand Matron and our

Associate Grand Patron to do many things that I should have been pleased to have done had it been possible.

Our Associate Grand Patron has cheerfully, faithfully and well performed the duties exacted of him, and I owe him a debt of gratitude which cannot be paid, or soon forgotten.

From the Grand Secretary I have received many kindnesses, and have found her ever ready and prompt to give from out her store of valuable information, collected during her successive years of office, any and all information and aid that has been desired.

To no one am I so much indebted as to our Worthy Grand Matron, and I feel that no Past Grand Patron has had, or could have had, a more womanly, faithful and zealous co-laborer than has fallen to my lot. Our relations in our work have indeed been most cordial; not even the semblance of discord has arisen. I grieve that I have not a wiser head and a more fluent tongue, so that I could correctly portray her worth as it appears to me. Her refined and gentle manner, her unfailing courtesy and affability, her intellectual power and wisdom, her self-sacrificing spirit, and untiring zeal have justly endeared her to all with whom she has come in contact and left its indelible impress. She exemplifies by her life, and in the administration of the affairs of her office, the principles of our Order, and proves to the world that a conscientious living up to these principles makes nobler and better men and women.

The additional duties imposed upon her at the last session of the Grand Chapter have caused her to sacrifice the pleasures of home and absent herself from her loved ones during a great part of the year, yet no word of complaint was ever heard. From the Chapters visited come only words of praise for the inspiration and good word of encouragement given, which spurred them on to renewed efforts as no Ritual could have done, and for the generous thoughts uttered which blesses not only the receiver but enlarges the heart and exalts the nature of the giver. Surely she will leave a rich inheritance to this Grand Chapter which she now so well adorns and crowns.

I would now thank you for the confidence you reposed in me

when you placed me in this office of trust. Everywhere I have been received with the greatest fraternal kindness; numberless courtesies have been extended to me, and uniform consideration and respect have been shown me; I realize it was the Office, rather than the individual, that was the recipient; yet I feel that great personal good has come to me in trying to perform its duties, for all of which please accept my heartfelt thanks. The record of the year has been placed before you. The verdict is in your hands.

When the hour comes, willingly do I retire from office, my greatest regret being that I could not have done better work, yet I can truthfully say that the little I have done has been performed with an honest desire to further the best interests of our Order. I trust that the broad mantle of Charity may be drawn over my many errors and omissions, and that you may remember only that he did the best he could, and in your Good-bye may I detect the "Peace be with thee."

Which Address was ordered to be referred to the Committee on Distribution.

The Worthy Grand Matron, Maria Akers Pierce, then read to the Grand Chapter her Annual Address, as follows:

ADDRESS OF THE WORTHY GRAND MATRON.

To the Officers and Members

of the Grand Chapter of the State of California, O. E. S.:

The echo of the "benediction" of '98 has scarcely ceased its vibrations when the Greeting of '99 comes to bid you welcome to this another "communication" under the banner of the Grand Chapter of the O. E. S. of the State of California, for with love unfeigned and a welcome never more sincere we greet you to-day and breathe a prayer to "Him who is the source of all wisdom and strength," that our deliberations may be unmarred by a thought, word or deed unworthy of one who has sworn allegiance to such principles as Charity, Truth and Loving Kindness. Let us be

ever mindful of the only incentive which should control our deliberations, to worship Him in spirit and in truth; then shall this Twenty-seventh Annual Communication of this Grand Chapter be as profitable as those enshrined in memory.

For twenty-seven years this banner has waved in our Golden State; through untiring and heroic service of its adherents we find the prosperity and magnitude which confronts us to-day and should prompt us to renew our pledge of obedience to its mandates.

When first assuming the duties of this responsible trust I freely placed upon the altar of this Grand Order my best offering, for I then consecrated my unreserved time, energy and self to the cause I had pledged to serve; hence this record must portray the work of the year, be it ever so imperfect, as prompted and executed only by such motives as would best promote our common cause; a record untarnished by unworthy ambition and ever fostering that spirit of humility born of the utter unworthiness that confronted me with the first faint realization of the great fact that with "privileges come responsibilities"; and if I have been the humble instrument of advancing the interests of our beloved and hallowed Order, it was because through temptations or triumph, discouragement or victory, "God was at the Helm."

The first weeks of my official term were claimed by an illness which proved a relentless rival to all attempts of labor either of a mental or physical character; hence December 9th must chronicle my first official duty, which was the installing of the officers of Carita Chapter, No. 115. The following evening I had the honor of installing the officers of Oak Leaf Chapter, No. 8, and on Saturday, December 23d, was called upon to install the officers of Mission Chapter, No. 155. On the last of December I mailed a New Year's Greeting, with a printed copy of the resolution referring to the "Schools of Instruction," to each Chapter. devise the most expedient method to operate this new system occupied the intervening weeks until January 21st. Had the Districts also been abolished with the deputies for the year, the schools could have been located more conveniently for the Chapters and given our experiment a better test. In four of the Districts the Chapters were so situated, geographically, that we deemed it necessary to hold two schools. Following is the record of the location, data and representation of each school:—

A second school was conducted in San Francisco for the benefit of Olive Branch and Century Chapters, U. D., and in Los Angeles for Esperanza and Los Angeles Chapters, U. D., these Chapters not having been instituted at the time of the schools for their respective districts. Authorized Sister Minnie Brown, Worthy Matron of Acacia Chapter, No. 21, to instruct other Chapters U. D. in the South.

On the 25th of April, at the earnest solicitation of a Committee on "Masonic Festival," I went to Los Angeles and assisted in the opening ceremonies of the Festival, a function in which the members of the Order of the Eastern Star, directed by Brother Hugh Fraser, took a most prominent part and merit much commendation. That the results were to be for a local benefit did not debar me from supporting the truism, "Give to a gracious message a thousand tongues."

In the latter part of August I issued a series of questions as below to each Worthy Matron in the Jurisdiction, thereby inviting suggestions and obtaining such information as might enable us the more intelligently to offer a solution to these difficulties, with the result that while a large majority are in favor of the "Schools" as compared with the District Deputy System, the demand for a personal visit of a Grand Officer is unanimous; and I firmly believe we should be slow to adopt a method which

would deprive our Chapters of so important a consideration. This Grand Chapter has under its fostering care a membership of nearly twelve thousand, representing 147 Chapters, in the main, zealous and ambitious aspirants to fulfill both the codes and principles of our tenets; we have given them birth, and must carefully uncontrolled by mercenary motives, protect guard and nourish the lives of these our offspring.

Foreseeing these requirements, and in response to earnest solicitation, I could not permit a ruling as hastily adopted as was this last year to blind me to a sense of duty that seemed at once imperative and unquestionable; I therefore have assumed the responsibility of reaching through a personal visit as many Chapters as the multiplicity of other duties would permit. That the objects of these visits are manifold, needs no further defense than that embodied in the results, one of which is a more intelligent understanding of the practicability of our new method of instruction, and most loudly commend the efforts of the various Worthy Matrons in executing, in their own respective Chapters the instruction received through this channel.

That some have been handicapped by a lack of unwillingness on the part of the officers to receive the instructions secondary, and others from the fact that they did not have as an incentive the visit of a Grand Officer, are facts that may somewhat influence our deliberations upon this subject.

Another undisputable conclusion these visits have revealed, namely: That our Chapters can boast of the perfection and uniformity of work which we claim to-day, is primarily attributable to the efforts of our Past Grand Patron, James B. Merritt, an obligation we have been too slow in acknowledging, for he it was who firstgrasped, and responded to, the requirements and demands of the Chapters (notably those in remote districts) for a printed form of instructions, thus exhaustively elucidating that work not detailed in our Ritual. That such a compilation should necessitate modification is true of all innovations, and we have as a result our present "Book of Instructions," the product of careful thought, and evidence of the unerring hand of wisdom; and there arises from every Chapter in this Jurisdiction sincere gratitude to our esteemed Past Worthy Grand Matron,

Sister Annie E. Briggs, and her able assistants, for this priceless monitor; and we trust that in the near future our General Grand Chapter shall authorize such a compilation which will give every detail of work from the time the gavel opens the Chapter, inclusive of the Installation and Funeral ceremonies, until the same signal closes it. That such a volume would be of inestimable value is obvious to those who have been the victim of constant and unauthorized innovations.

After a concentration of the multiplicity of opinions, as set forth in response to the line of questions, and with personal and unbiased observations, as above set forth, relative to the year's experiment, we are forced to admit that this system, bereft of a personal visit of a Grand Officer, fails to meet the just demands and apparent requirements which shall best foster and advance our Order in the Jurisdiction. We cannot, therefore, recommend a continuance of any system which restricts our obligations within the limits of theoretical work alone, limitations which have excluded those of the Chapters who found it impossible to be represented at the school for their District, from any official benefits from the Grand Chapter (save through the channel of correspondence), and abandoned other Chapters, than where the school was conducted, to a neglect that must predict retrogradation; nor can we conscientiously advise a return to the District Deputy System, therefore, in submitting the following recommendations for your consideration, it is with a view only to what we deem will best subserve our requirements, and urge careful consideration and conscientious deliberations in the legislation of this the vital question of the hour.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

No. 1.—That our Jurisdiction be divided into ten Districts; that for each District shall be appointed an officer to be known as "Grand Instructor"; that these appointments be solely controlled by a standard of qualifications, regardless of personal favoritism or Chapter membership. We would have these officers selected and recommended by the retiring Grand Matron. That these "Grand Instructors" be personally and collectively instructed in every detail of the work by the Worthy

Grand Matron, through an efficient set of officers, prior to their assuming their duties; that they shall then go to their respective Districts and conduct a School of Instruction in each Chapter, devoting at least one day to the same; that the expenses thereby incurred shall be divided pro rata among the several Chapters of each District. We further recommend that every Chapter shall be visited during the year by the Worthy Grand Matron, or the Associate Grand Matron; that the expenses be governed by the same law as that in present use.

No. 2.—That the resolution compelling the Worthy Grand Patron and Worthy Grand Matron to invite the officers of a Subordinate Chapter to exemplify the work for the Grand Chapter be so amended as to leave it optional whether the Grand Officers, if properly prepared, or a corps of officers be selected from various Chapters, perform this duty, or it be relegated to the officers of a Subordinate Chapter, believing our uniform system of instruction should qualify any member to fill her station in any Chapter without friction.

No. 3.—That the resolution pertaining to the Worthy Grand Matron as authority on Ritual be so amended as to place this authority in the hands of a Standing Committee to be known as "Committee on Ritualistic Work."

No. 4.—That the time for holding the election of officers in the Subordinate Chapters be changed to a date prior to the meeting of the Grand Chapter, instead of so closely following it, as at present, to the end, that we believe the various Chapters will receive a far greater benefit through a representative who is just entering upon her year's work than one just retiring. We could also have the new officers in our Proceedings.

The abolishment of the District Deputy System has left us with no authorized method of obtaining a report from the several Chapters. By means of the blank form, above referred to, we have been able to glean such information in reference to the work of the Secretaries and a general statement, if, of prosperity, or grievance. Especially was this report valuable from those we were unable to reach in person; and we are most happy to state that, with a very few exceptions, every Chapter is evidencing progress

and prosperity in the highest sense of its requirements, and also bear testimony of conditions, both numerically and financially as most flattering, and in the upbuilding and uplifting of our principles, an advancement which is most gratifying.

The Chapters at Dunsmuir, Sanger, Red Bluff and San Luis Obispo are in great need of prompt consideration and a helping hand.

An attempt to render an adequate report, however exhaustive, of the beautiful work, lavish hospitality and hearty welcome of those Chapters it has been my privilege to meet, must prove futile, each occasion being redolent with a halo of fraternal love, and immortalized by memories that shall ever serve as a silent monitor that a better life and higher ideal may attest the sincerity of our appreciation. I cannot forbear especially mentioning the elaborate receptions tendered in my home Chapter, Oak Leaf, No. 8, both upon my return from the Grand Chapter one year ago and upon the occasion of my last visit, Thursday, October 11th, where a welcome, I know unfeigned, was breathed through flower, song and speech. I was also the recipient of a most exquisite piece of cut-glass from the Chapter, accompanied by "Words that Burn," from our beloved sister, Mary E. Partridge.

Oak Leaf, "thou blessed covenant of my soul, I owe thee much, Far more than I can ever say."

We may not, as Chapters or individuals, be able to bring to the feet of the world, the victory of a Dewey, but with heroic and persistent combatants against the more formidable foes of malice, envy and self, we may gain a victory that shall win us the immortal laurels of divine approbation.

MASONIC WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' HOME.

In the early months of the year I joined with our Home Committee in a conference to consider certain methods that might be most expedient in liquidating our obligation to this fund. My confidence in this committee, whose past faithfulness and zeal has been weighed and not found wanting, made me willing to rele-

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gate this perplexing question to their better judgment and dis-That the Order of the Eastern Star has been a most potent factor through your unremitting labor and marvelous generosity, at the Masonic Festival, and your liberal donations to the Grand Chapter fund in making possible this grand institution, is conceded by the Board of Trustees and the entire Masonic fraternity. Let us not be weary in well doing.

I have signed the following dispensations to institute new Chapters: Los Angeles, Esperanza, Olive Branch, Century, Sisson, Lexington, Carnation, Long Beach, and Harbor.

The hour growing late, the reading of the reports of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer were deferred until Wednesday morning.

Greetings and regrets from officers of the General Grand Chapter, as follows, were read and ordered spread upon the Minutes:

ORANGE, MASS., Sept. 20, 1899.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

SISTERS AND BROTHERS—The receipt of your kind invitation to be present at your Twenty-seventh Annual Session reminds me of the watchful care and love of our Heavenly Father, who has brought us safely through another year.

DEAR SISTER WILLATS-Please express to the Grand Chapter my sincere regrets at my inability to be present and take part in the Session now about to convene. For many reasons I regard the Session of more than ordinary importance to the Order of the Eastern Star in this Grand Jurisdiction. One year ago the Grand Chapter adopted an entirely new method of inspection of the work-the old "District Deputy System," socalled, was relegated to the past as being unsatisfactory. There was some difference of opinion among the representatives then present as to the wisdom of the plan adopted, but none as to the necessity for a change of some kind. The "District School" or "School of Instruction" method of disseminating information was adopted and has now been tested for a year and the Grand Chapter is to be called upon to pass upon its merits. That it has been tried under the most favorable circumstances, no one will deny-that it has been productive of splendid results no one will disputebut whether it is the best plan to finally adopt is still an open question. From a personal observation of the benefits to be derived from these "Schools of Instruction" when conducted by one who is thoroughly familiar with the Ritual and the Jurisprudence of the Order, one who has been fitted by nature, education, surroundings and associations to exemplify its teachings and impart to others its impressive lessons, as is our Worthy Grand Matron, I can unhesitatingly testify; but in passing upon this system the Grand Chapter must remember that our Worthy Grand Matron has been willing, like Queen Esther, "to sacrifice her crown and life," to promote the prosperity of the Order.

There are many noble woman who are members of the Order in this Grand Jurisdiction who would fill the position of Worthy Grand Matron most acceptably to the Order itself, but who simply could not do this work which our present Worthy Grand Matron has done—some because

Therefore, your committee drafted a Form for bidders to use, containing a contract and an itemized list of supplies and printing needed and used by this Grand Chapter and our Subordinate Chapters.

In answer to our invitation eight bids were received, ranging from \$711.50 to \$1,200.

Spaulding & Co. being the lowest, we awarded the contract to that firm for \$711.50, and have filed the contract, containing an itemized list of supplies and printing, with your Grand Secretary.

We recommend that this or some such Form be adopted and used in future. If this be done we feel sure the cost of printing will be greatly reduced and the work much more satisfactorily done.

During the Chapter year 1897 and '98 the printing of the Proceedings and four other small items amounted to \$860.45, while under the present contract the same work can be duplicated and enough supplies and printing added to supply our Grand and Subordinate Chapters for more than a year and at a reduction of more than \$100.

- I. If the majority of the Committee of Investigation on a petition for affiliation or for the degrees report favorably, the petition may be balloted upon, even if not signed by the full committee, provided, that one of that majority is the Brother who was appointed on such committee.
- II. That Recommendation No. 8 be not concurred in for the reason that under the laws of our State "a husband is not bound to maintain his wife's children by a former husband" (C. C. 209), and such children do not inherit any property descending from such second husband unless legally adopted by him. A step-daughter is ineligible for the further reason that she sustains no blood relation to her step-father, the Mason.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON GRAND MATRON PRESIDING.

To the Worthy Grand Patron, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

Your Special Committee on Worthy Grand Matron presiding, continued from the last session, with instructions to report at this meeting, respectfully submit the following:

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Resolved, That Section 9 of Article I of the Constitution be amended by striking out the words "shall preside at the meetings of the Grand Chapter" and inserting in their stead the words "shall assist the Grand Matron in the discharge of her duties."

That Section 10 of Article I of the Constitution be amended by inserting after the words "the Grand Matron" the following words: "shall preside at the meetings of the Grand Chapter," so that the two sections when amended shall read as follows:

ARTICLE I.

GRAND PATRON.

Section 9. The Grand Patron shall assist the Grand Matron in the discharge of her duties, appoint all committees, see that the rules and regulations of the Order are strictly enforced, and that the officers faithfully perform their respective duties. He has power to convene a Chapter within the Jurisdiction, to preside therein, to inspect their proceedings, and require their conformity to the laws of the Order; to suspend for good cause, for a limited period, or until the annual meeting of the Grand Chapter, any Subordinate Chapter; to grant dispensations for new Chapters, on proper application of nine or more members of the Order in good standing, provided such Chapter shall first have procured the written consent of the Chapter nearest to or most affected by the proposed new organization. In case consent is refused to form such new Chapter, the Grand Patron may ascertain the reason therefor, and, if after carefully investigating the same he should be of the opinion that it would be for the best interests of the Order that such new Chapter be formed, he may grant a dispensation notwithstanding such refusal; to require the attendance of and information from any Grand Officer respecting his or her office; to delegate authority to confer the degrees at sight upon a sufficient number of worthy persons, in towns and cities where no Chapter exists, for the purpose of organizing a new Chapter; to call special meetings of the Grand Chapter; shall decide all questions of law or usage submitted to him, subject, however, to an appeal to the Grand Chapter and until such decisions or opinions be reversed by the Grand Chapter, they shall be held binding as between the parties thereto; and give such instructions and directions as the good of the Order may require. During the vacation of the Grand Chapter to exercise all its executive powers, and report his official acts to the Grand Chapter at its annual convocation.

GRAND MATRON.

SEC. 10. The Grand Matron shall preside at the meetings of the Grand Chapter, assist the Grand Patron in the discharge of his duties. She

shall have power to grant all special dispensations, except for the purpose of organizing new Chapters; to convene any Chapter within the Jurisdiction; to preside therein; to inspect their proceedings; require their conformity to the laws of the Order; to sign, in connection with the Grand Patron, all charters and dispensations granted; sign all warrants drawn on the Grand Treasurer; to appoint Representatives near other organized Grand Chapters, and to receive and accredit Representatives from them; make herself thoroughly acquainted with the workings of the Order throughout the Jurisdiction; and at each annual communication recommend such legislation as in her judgment the welfare of the Order may require.

The above proposed amendments to the Constitution, submitted by Mary E. Partridge at the last session of the Grand Chapter, and referred to the Committee on Constitution and Laws, and which were by said committee referred to your Committee on Grand Matron Presiding, have received our careful consideration and we recommend the adoption of the same.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON NECROLOGY.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

SISTERS AND BROTHERS—We, your committee, to whom was ascribed the sad duty of drafting suitable resolutions of respect to the memory of our departed Sisters and Brothers, beg to submit the following:

> "There is a reaper whose name is Death, And with his sickle keen, He reaps the bearded grain at a breath, And the flowers that grow between."

Again we pause in our considerations and deliberations affecting the good of the Order, and devote a brief season to our recollections of departed members, friends and associates, and to lay on their tombs our glad tributes to their worth, and our sad memories of their loss.

Again we are reminded how swiftly glide these lives of ours; that the dreams of hope are but shadows; that the honors for which we clutch must wither in our hands; that the cares, the joys, the fears of life alike soon find an end.

Scenes like this, common as they are, never over the wide world lose their interest. Infidel and pagan and Christian alike celebrate them, and in varying forms and with differing hopes and aspirations come to weep over the graves of their dear departed. To all alike the veil that separates the present of life from its future is equally impenetrable to the natural eye; but to the eye of faith and hope, and, as we believe, to the philosophic vision as well, there opens a field of view which should lead us not to mourn at the death in the fullness of accomplished years of those we have loved and respected, but rather to be soberly glad for them, who, having faithfully filled their space and appointed time, and having borne the last trial of humanity, have been admitted to the life of the mysterious future. We see "as through a glass darkly," indeed, but our Sisters and Brothers, and all who have gone before and with them do, we believe, see and feel clearly the peace that belongs to them who with pure hearts and faithful endeavor have, in whatever station, run the race that was set before them.

When all things move in what we imagine to be the due course of nature, as year after year hurries along, the Divine Father greatly mitigates the fear of death. Before one reaches the allotted three score and ten, the time comes when he feels that the majority of all whom he could know well and love well have gone over to the other side. The sound of a tree that has fallen in the forest becomes a familiar sound, no longer alarming. The multitude of old and dear friends, who are invisible but still so real, occupy more and more of our thoughts. Calling our faith and philosophy to our aid, we try to believe that it is not death that we dread but dying. We become so weary of eternal turmoil, of sorrow and trouble, that in despondent hours we fancy that we can almost envy that brilliant soldier of the late war whose last words were, "Let us cross the river and rest in the shade."

"O for the touch of a vanished hand, And the sound of a voice that is still."

Georgia Anna Matfield, Past Worthy Grand Matron, was born in Homer, Licking County, Ohio, January 31, 1851. Her bright intellect and advanced accomplishments for one of her age enabled her to teach school at the age of fifteen, and during her second term she entered the Normal School in Cook County, Illinois, after which she taught in the High School until 1877. She then entered into literary pursuits as assistant editor in a work entitled "Biographical Encyclopedia of Great Men of the West," and her whole soul seemed centered in the work, which is a monument to her genius. In 1881, at Marshal, Texas, she was married to George H. Matfield, and in 1885 they removed to San Diego, her home at the time of her death. In November of 1897 she took her daughter to the City of Mexico, not only for her daughter's failing health, but also to investigate and study the educational systems and resources of that country, on which subject she was then gathering material for a book. On Christ-

mas night she was stricken with paralysis and lingered in an unconscious state till the 29th, when she gently passed away into that dreamless sleep that knows no waking, save in that better world where death comes not. Her bereaved and loving daughter, alone and a "stranger in a strange land," tenderly laid her out, dressing her in the pure white silk, so typical of her life, in which she last appeared a bright star in a brilliant assemblage of notables gathered together in celebration of the festivities of the season peculiar to that country. She was laid to rest for a brief season at the City of Mexico on December 31st, the laws not permitting her remains to be removed for a period of years; after which she will sleep in her sunny southern home where tender and loving hands will ever see that "upon her grave flowerets will bloom amid all the countless activities of Nature's life."

"The murmuring brook, the bird on airy wing,
And whispering pines will here her requiem sing."

"Over her the fleeting shadows will pass. The rising sun will scatter over the chambers of the dead his gladsome rays, and tint the western sky with the glories of departing day. In the hush of night the feeble rays of countless stars, traveling centuries on their journey here, will finally rest upon her grave."

Sister Matfield was a member of Southern Star Chapter, No. 96, having joined in 1889, and was elected its second Worthy Matron, serving for two years. In 1891 she served as District Deputy Grand Matron of the Ninth District, and in October, 1892, she was elected Worthy Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of California, which position she filled with distinguished honor.

Memory cherishes no brighter spot in the life of the Chairman of your committee than the year he was associated with Sister Matfield, as Grand Patron, during her term as Grand Matron; and never did two officers work more harmoniously in the discharge of their duties. She was ever courteous and deferential, yet firm and self-reliant withal. Eager to help and suggest, plan and devise for the good of the Order she loved so well, and willing to undertake any work, no matter how arduous, if it only improve or advance its best interests. In speaking of her in his address to the Grand Chapter (Proceedings 1893, p. 28), he said: "Our Worthy Grand Matron has proved the wisdom of our choice by her indefatigable efforts to promote the welfare of the Order throughout the State. Zealous and untiring in her labors, thorough and efficient in her work, eloquent in her discourses, yet simple and homelike in her manner toward all, endearing her to every member whithersoever dispersed, and leaving the glad feeling in every heart that they were better for having met and known her."

There was remarkable uniformity and harmony in all her faculties. Her natural endowments may have been excelled in degree but not in quality, and their combination made an extraordinary woman. She was kind, gentle, polite, liberal and unselfish. She had a keen sense of right, justice, honor and duty, supported by strong convictions and affections and unfaltering courage and womanhood. Her powers of thought were remarkable for activity, clearness and accuracy.

Her life was not fragmentary and unfinished, but full-orbed and complete. Death was not an interruption, but a climax. Her sun was neither obscured nor eclipsed, but followed its appointed path to the western horizon. So she departed, and above her spirit and her fame abides the enduring covenant of peace. "Her memory, like a cloudless sky; her conscience, like a sea of rest."

She had not passed on life's highway the stone that marks the highest point; but, being weary for a moment, she lay down by the wayside, and, using her burden for a pillow, fell into that dreamless sleep that kisses down her eyelids still.

There is a philosophy in life and death that furnishes more or less consolation and compensation to alleviate our sorrows and reconcile us to our losses. Every human life is a history, and in that of our dearly lamented friend and Sister there is everything to love and admire, and nothing wanting in qualities or action that a longer lease of life could have supplied to make a character more deserving our commemoration.

Come when it may to the young or old, the inevitable and universal summons must always impress us with the profound mystery of life and death, the uncertainty of humanity; but whenever we behold an apparently well person fall midway his journey, arrested at the very moment when earthly rewards and honors were being reaped, and when their usefulness was greatest to their fellow men, we can only repeat again and again the mournful exclamation of Burke over his dead son: "What shadows we are; what shadows we pursue!" And yet we press on, grasping these shadows as if they were priceless jewels, and making our preparations to live as if our earthly existence were immortal.

"Life is a narrow vale between the cold and barren peaks of two eternities. We strive in vain to look beyond the heights. We cry aloud, and the only answer is the ccho of our wailing cry. From the voiceless lips of the unreplying dead there comes no word; but in the night of death hope sees a star and listening love hears the rustle of a wing."

To her the wondrous portals of the unseen world have opened; and the mysteries of death, revealing "what was and is and is to come," have solved the mysteries of life. Faith may disclose to our grateful eyes glimpses of heaven's beatitudes, yet when her associates here realize that we shall see her face again no more forever, "one human tear shall fall and be forgiven."

"The surging sea of human life forever onward rolls,
And bears to the eternal shore its daily freight of souls."

"Though bravely sails our bark to-day, pale death sits at the prow."

"His life was gentle, and the elements
So mixed in him, that Nature might stand up
And say to all the world, This was a man!"

Rev. Jonathan Avery Shepherd was born on the 26th day of August, 1816, at the town of Brandon, in the State of Vermont, and died at Santa Rosa, in the State of California, on the 13th day of March, 1898.

He was a member and Past Patron of Rose Valley Chapter, No. 33, and Past Associate Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter of California.

Brother Shepherd was a strong man mentally and physically, but no disproportion marred the symmetry of his character, and no irregular outlines called attention to the strength and beauty of his structure.

His conversation abounded in simple and delightful charms, and he was a favorite in every social circle. His hospitality had all the genial warmth of a gentleman of the old school. He had an inexhaustible fund of human gentleness, which made him naturally courteous and amiable.

The grand old English poet, Chancer, says: "He is a gentleman who does gentle deeds," and the life of our departed friend and Brother is so full of the constant performance of such deeds that he made himself of the true gentry and issued his own patent of nobility. He did not seem to tire of such well-doing; the passing of the years and the coming on of old age brought physical change, but "that good gray head which all men knew" was ever the servant of the kind heart. He seemed to have followed the sound advice of the old philosopher, and to be able "to resist with success the frigidity of old age by combining the body, the mind, and the heart, keeping these in parallel vigor by exercise, study, and love."

A life of virtue and well-doing prepared him for the great end. As his life had been so was his death. It was most fitting that it should come to him quietly, gently, and without shock.

He was to all of us most excellent example, and like him

"So may'st thou live till like ripe fruit thou drop Into thy mother's lap, or be with ease Gathered, not harshly plucked, for death mature."

"The rank is but the guinea's stamp,
The man's the gowd for a' that."

Malinda Charlotte Parker was born on the 20th day of March, 1825, near the town of Bluntville, in Blunt County, in the State of Alabama, and died at the city of Tulare, in the county of Tulare, in the State of California, on the 31st day of March, 1898.

She was a member of Martha Washington Chapter, No. 13, of Visalia, and its first Worthy Matron, being one of the oldest members of the Order in the State. She was also a Past Associate Grand Matron of the Grand

Chapter of this State, and one of its most devoted and regular attendants, until age creeping on apace prevented her from meeting with us each year, much to her regret and sorrow.

Although retaining her membership in Martha Washington Chapter, at Visalia, of which she was a charter member, she had resided for a number of years in the adjoining town of Tulare, and it was mainly through her earnest efforts that Tulare Chapter, No. 94, was instituted in October, 1897, and she was always pleased to call it the "child of her adoption," while the Chapter was always happy in being so "adopted" and looking up to her as its "foster mother." She loved the Order and if health permitted never missed a meeting. How often, in her own inimitable way, did she chide the younger members for non-attendance, comparing her age with theirs. She always spoke to the point on any question, and in no uncertain language. How vividly can we see her still, those who have attended the Grand Chapter for years, as she sat quietly and attentively listening to some interesting argument pro and con; when she concluded there had been sufficient discussion she would arise, and—well. we all knew what that meant. In language quaint, homely and "blunt", but happy withal, probably acquired in the place of her nativity, she would strike right and left, regardless of where or whom it hit, and ruthlessly demolish and lay bare the best set speech. You could not get angry, not even offended, for she was so original. There was only "one" of her; she had no counterpart, and ah! we miss her still. Each succeeding Grand Chapter there seems to be something missing. We look in vain for the old familiar face, for the chair that is vacant still. Our Sister has finished her allotted task in the conflict of life. The Supreme Grand Patron has summoned her home; she is gone. The Chapter of her earthly sojourn is closed, but her many virtues shall not go unrecorded.

"Like weary and worn out children, that sigh for the daylight's close, He knows that they oft are longing for home and its sweet repose; So he calls them in from their labors, ere the shadows round them creep, And silently watching o'er them. He giveth his loved ones sleep."

> "Like a shadow thrown Softly and sweetly from a passing cloud, Death fell upon her."

Elizabeth Ferris Phillips was born on the 5th day of March, 1828, at the town of New Castle, in the State of New York, and died in the city of San Francisco on the 17th day of December, 1897.

She was a member of Mission Chapter, No. 155, at the time of her death. She was a Past Matron of California Chapter, No. 4, and Past Associate Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of the State of California.

Sister Phillips was one of the oldest and most devoted members of the Order in the State, having joined California Chapter in 1874. From thence to the end of her allotted time, early and late, in sunshine and in storm, in season and out of season, with heart, hand, brain and purse, she toiled to advance the best interests of the Order. With ability possessed by few, with zeal surpassed by none, actuated by love for the pure principles of the institution, with the sole desire of doing good to her fellow beings, she earnestly and untiringly labored on, nobly bearing the standard on which is inscribed, "I have seen His star in the East, and have come to worship Him."

In addition to serving as Worthy Matron of Old California Chapter, No. 4, she was for fourteen years its Treasurer, and her oft-repeated election to that responsible office is the best commentary upon the manner in which she filled it, and the esteem in which she was held by her associates.

"She hath done what she could," may she rest in peace.

"But now we miss her in her wonted place, And search in vain for that congenial face."

To the bereaved relatives and friends of those who have gone to the other side we tender our heartfelt sympathies in this dark hour of affliction. Surely we cannot mourn as untimely the ending of the lives of these "tried servants of God." To us, to whom our faith holds out its promise of an existence continued somewhere, where the virtues developed here shall continue and grow, it is matter of high exultation that souls so pure, so lofty, so fortunate, have passed on safely, and without a stain, to another stage of being, where

"that, which lived True life, lives on."

"Weep not that their toils are over, weep not that their race is run; God grant we may rest as calmly when our work, like theirs, is done! Till then we would yield with gladness our treasures to Him to keep, And rejoice in the sweet assurance—He giveth His loved ones sleep."

We offer the following resolution and respectfully move its adoption: Resolved, That in the death of such eminent and Worthy Past Grand Officers the Grand Chapter will sadly miss their wise and timely counsel and advice. That their places here will be hard to fill, and that the memory of their long and able service will be ever with us as a safe guide in all our doings.

That a page be set aside in our Proceedings to the memory of each of our Sisters and Brother.

We have carefully considered the matter, and from past experience believe that no Chapter should be permitted to receive charges or prefer the same against any of its officers or members unless its funds will warrant any expenses which may be incurred; and that in no case should the same be a charge upon or paid by the Grand Chapter.

We therefore offer the following resolution and recommend its adoption: Resolved, That a new section be added to Article VII of the Constitution to be numbered 14, which shall read as follows:

Section 14. No Chapter shall receive nor permit charges to be preferred against any of its officers or members until it be first ascertained that there are ample funds in its treasury, not otherwise appropriated or liable to be drawn upon, to amply pay all expenses which may be incurred by a trial upon such charges; and in no case shall the expenses, or any part thereof, of any trial in a Chapter be a charge upon or paid out of any funds of the Grand Chapter.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WARRANTS AND DISPENSATIONS.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

We your committee, to whom was referred the petition of the members of Century Chapter asking to be allowed to take the name of King Solomon's Chapter, have had the same under consideration, and believing that the members are the best judges of what their name should be and seeing no valid objection to their taking that of King Solomon's, we would recommend that the petition be granted.

Past Grand Matron Abbie Elvenia Krebs, from the Committee on Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home, presented the following report from that committee:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MASONIC WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' HOME.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

The Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home being now completed and in active operation, it seems proper to pass briefly in review the connection with it of the Order of the Eastern Star.

The idea of a Home for the widows and orphans of Masons to be under the supervision of the Order of the Eastern Star was early entertained in the minds of its members.

Its first expression to the Grand Chapter was given at the session of 1878, when Sister Susan H. Snook, Worthy Matron of Centennial Chapter, offered the following resolution: "Whereas, The Order of the Eastern Star has now become well established, and as one of the principal objects of the organization is Charity, it becomes a serious question how we can best extend our aid to the poor and needy of our Order. Shall we do the most good by individual effort under the direction of each Subordinate Chapter, or would it not be more efficient and useful to combine our efforts and organize an Aid Society, or Home under the direction of the Grand Chapter? Many of the other States of the Union have such a Society under the supervision of the Masonic fraternity, and it is a well-known and acknowledged fact that ladies are more successful in managing charitable institutions, and there is no doubt but that our good brothers would co-operate with us in this good work if well begun. To bring this matter properly before the Grand Chapter, I offer the following resolution:

"Resolved, That a committee of five be appointed by the Grand Patron, to devise a plan for the organization of a Home or Aid Society for the widows and orphans of indigent Masons, and members of the Eastern Star, said committee to report at the next session of this Grand Body."

The resolution was adopted, and the Grand Patron, Brother Rollin G. Gaskill, appointed the following named persons to serve as a committee thereon, viz.:

Brothers Jerome Spaulding and W. S. Phelps, Sisters Annie E. Douglass, Susan H. Snook and Henrietta Whitcher.

No report is recorded as emanating from the committee, and no further action was taken until the session of 1889, when it was suggested by Sister Abbie E. Krebs that a committee of three be appointed to consider the advisability of taking steps for the foundation of a Home, said committee to report at this session.

The Worthy Grand Patron appointed as such committee Sisters Abbie E. Krebs and Mary B. Moore, and Brother A. C. Hartley.

In the report the committee referred the subject back to the Grand Chapter for final determination, whereupon Sister Douglass moved that the Committee on Home be continued one year, with full power to act.

Brother John McMurry offered a substitute, "that a committee of five Past Grand Matrons be appointed in place of the original committee," which was adopted, and the following persons were appointed, viz.: Sisters Abbie E. Krebs, Mary B. Moore, Mary A. Flint, Mary E. Partridge and Annie E. Douglass.

With the exception of a pledge of \$500 for the Grand Chapter, and permission to the committee to print a Digest of Decisions for sale to the Chapters, the proceeds of which should go to the Home Fund, little was accomplished until the session of 1891. In the meantime the Masonic fraternity had been seriously considering the necessity of establishing a "Home" for the widows and orphans of Masons, and at the communication of the Grand Lodge of that year had decided to enter upon the work.

The Grand Chapter recognizing the impracticability of continuing the work by itself, decided to co-operate with the Grand Lodge in this project. Rabbi Voorsanger of the Grand Lodge Committee was introduced by Sister Krebs to the Grand Chapter and made a strong appeal for assistance, after which the cordial, earnest and hearty support of the Grand Chapter was pledged to the support of the enterprise.

To meet the changed conditions the title of the committee, by resolution unanimously adopted, was changed from "Home Fund Committee" to The Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home Committee, its personnel remaining as before; and it was "authorized and empowered to solicit funds and contributions for the erection and maintenance of a Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home, and to do all things relative to, and for the advancement of, the purposes for which the committee had been appointed, and to act conjointly with the committee appointed by the Grand Lodge of Masons at its recent convocation," etc.

Thus the scope of the work was changed and the efforts of the Order were directed towards assisting the Masonic fraternity in carrying out their charitable purposes. A vacancy being caused in the committee by the death of Sister Annie E. Douglass, Sister M. Josephine Young was appointed to fill it, and since that time no change has been made, each sister being re-appointed as her time expired.

October 14, 1896, the corner-stone of the Masonic Home was laid by the Grand Lodge, and at the session of the Grand Chapter which convened the succeeding week a resolution was adopted, empowering the committee "to tender to the Trustees of the Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Home our assistance in fitting up and furnishing the building when completed."

In pursuance of this action, the efforts of the committee since that time have been directed to the enlargement of the fund that, if possible, the entire furnishing of the building might be accomplished by the Order of the Eastern Star.

In May, 1898, a Festival was held in San Francisco for the purpose of raising funds wherewith to complete the building. By the efforts of the

various Masonic Bodies, assisted by the Order of the Eastern Star, a large sum was raised, enabling the Trustees of the Home to finish their work in the most substantial manner, and on October 12th the building was dedicated to its destined purposes by the Grand Lodge F. & A. M. with appropriate ceremonies.

It may not be inappropriate to state that not less than \$6,000 was added to the building fund by the efforts of members of the Eastern Star, and that due credit for the assistance so willingly rendered has been accorded them by those having the matter in charge.

Since that time the efforts of your committee have been directed towards increasing the fund of this Grand Chapter to complete, if possible, the full sum required for furnishing the building, but we can only report progress in that direction.

Past Grand Matron Eva M Porter from the Special Committee to whom had been referred Recommendation No. 1, in report of the Worthy Grand Matron, presented the following report from her committee:

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Special Committee on Recommendation No. 1 of the Worthy Grand Matron's report beg leave to report as follows:

We have seriously considered the recommendation and concluded that it would be going back to the old unsatisfactory District Deputy System to adopt the recommendation.

Where the work is intrusted to so many it is not liable to be uniform. Again it is much more effective and satisfactory to the Chapters to receive instructions from an elective Grand Officer.

We believe the expense can be lessened and the work more satisfactorily done if one or two could give it. The "Schools of Instruction" have been so successful the past year. We feel if the work could be divided between the Worthy Grand Matron and the Associate Grand Matron it would not be burdensome, but otherwise a pleasure.

We therefore recommend that the Worthy Grand Matron or the Associate Grand Matron hold a School of Instruction in each Chapter in the jurisdiction.

We also recommend that the jurisdiction be divided equally, as may be decided by the Worthy Grand Matron.

We would further recommend the actual expense be paid by this Grand Chapter.

We therefore offer the following amendment to the Constitution, That Section 19, Article I, be stricken out, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

It shall be the duty of the Worthy Grand Matron and the Associate Grand Matron to hold Schools of Instruction in each Chapter in the jurisdiction

Immediately after the close of the Annual Session of the Grand Chapter the Worthy Grand Matron shall divide the jurisdiction as nearly equal as convenience will permit, taking one portion for her work and allot the other portion to the Associate Grand Matron.

The Worthy Grand Matron and Associate Grand Matron shall receive instruction in the work from the retiring Grand Matron and as laid down in the "Book of Instruction," and be thoroughly qualified for teaching a uniform work.

The necessary expenses for holding Schools of Instruction shall be paid by the Grand Chapter.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be placed in the hands of the Committee on Widows' and Orphans' Home for the furnishing of the Home, provided the Board of Trustees of the Widows' and Orphans' Home of the Grand Lodge of F. and A. M. give this Order credit for the amount of about \$4,500, already contributed and not credited to the furnishing fund.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND LAWS.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S., of California:

Your committee to whom was referred the resolution of the Special Committee on Grand Matron Presiding, proposing to amend Sections 9 and 10 of Article I of the Constitution, beg leave to report as follows:

These proposed amendments will make a most radical change in our procedure, and is fraught with grave responsibilities and consequences.

We believe it unwise to tamper with or change existing legislation which has carried us through twenty-eight long years with such marked success. We stand in the lead of all Grand Jurisdictions, and we have a right to attribute our standing to the manner in which our business has been conducted and managed. We do not wish to imply that it might not be as well done in the future as in the past, but we know what it has

been and is now, and if permitted to remain as it is, we have no reason to doubt that it would so continue. To indulge in experiments is hazardous.

We therefore offer the following resolution and recommend its adoption: Resolved, That the Resolution of the Special Committee on Grand Matron Presiding, amending Sections 9 and 12 of Article I of the Constitution be not concurred in. Respectfully submitted,

Resolved, That Section 2, Article I of the Constitution of the Grand Chapter be so amended as to read after the word jurisdiction, fifteenth line of this section, the following, to wit:

"Provided, however, that there is hereby created the title of Venerable Past Grand Patron, with all the rights and privileges of membership, to be conferred upon our beloved Brother William S. Moses, of Golden Gate Chapter, No. 1, in view of the fact that he was the first Deputy Grand Patron, and as such organized the first Chapters in this State."

So that the section as amended shall read as follows:

OFFICERS AND MEMBERS.

Sec. 2. The Grand Chapter shall consist of a Grand Patron, Grand Matron, Grand Associate Patron, Grand Associate Matron, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Chaplain, Grand Conductress, Grand Associate Conductress, Grand Marshal, Grand Adah, Grand Ruth, Grand Esther, Grand Martha, Grand Electa, Grand Warder, Grand Organist, Grand Sentinel; all Past Grand Patrons, Past Grand Matrons, Past Grand Associate Patrons, Past Grand Associate Matrons, Past Grand Secretaries, Past Grand Treasurers, District Deputy Grand Matrons, the

Matrons, Patrons and Associate Matrons (or such representatives of Chapters as shall be legally accredited) of every chartered Chapter under its jurisdiction, together with the Past Matrons and Past Patrons of said Chapters; all of whom shall be members in good standing of some subordinate Chapter within its jurisdiction. *Provided*, however, that there is hereby created the title of Venerable Past Grand Patron, with all the rights and privileges of membership, to be conferred upon our beloved Brother William S. Moses, of Golden Gate Chapter, No. 1, in view of the fact that he was the first Deputy Grand Patron, and as such organized the first Chapters in this State.

The foregoing Officers, Past Officers and Representatives shall be the only voters in this Grand Chapter; they shall have but one vote each, except the first three officers of Subordinate Chapters, or their representatives, either of whom in the absence of his or her associates may cast the three votes; and the Past Matrons and Past Patrons, who shall be entitled respectively to one collective vote. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer may give the casting vote.

Past Grand Patron Jacob Franklin Boller, Chairman of the Committee on Constitution and Laws, presented a verbal report from his Committee approving the resolutions as read, and the Committee recommended the approval of the Constitutional amendment as presented by Sister Krebs. The report of the Committee was adopted, and Section 2 of Art. I of the Constitution as above amended was unanimously adopted.

Past Grand Patron Jacob Franklin Boller, Chairman of the Committee on Constitution and Laws, presented the following report from that committee:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND LAWS.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

We, your committee, to whom was referred so much of the Grand Matron's Address as is contained in Recommendation No. 3, beg leave to report as follows:

We have carefully considered the subject matter contained in the Recommendation, and believe that more stability and permanency in the rendition of the work will be obtained and secured by having a permanent Committee on Ritualistic Work, to whom all matters pertaining to the same may be finally referred, and from whose decision there shall be no appeal save to the Grand Chapter. We are all aware that each change of administration brings with it the liability to change in minor if not more important

matters concerning the rendition of the work, and in the interpretation of the Ritual. This can be avoided by placing the whole matter in a standing committee, to hold office during life or until a vacancy occurs by removal or resignation.

We would not take from the Grand Matron the power to make rulings during the recess of the Grand Chapter, but would have her decide questions and matters only in consonance with rulings already made, and if a doubt arise she may communicate with the committee before making her decision; and all decisions made by her during her term of office shall be referred to the committee.

We therefore offer the following resolution and recommend its adoption: Resolved, That there be, and there is hereby created a Standing Committee of this Grand Chapter, to be known as and called the "Committee on Ritualistic Work," to consist of three Past Grand Matrons, well versed and qualified in the Ritualistic work, who shall hold office for life, or until a vacancy be created by removal from the Jurisdiction, or by resignation. The Grand Patron shall appoint said committee, and when a vacancy occurs for any reason it shall be filled by the Grand Patron then presiding.

The duties of said committee shall be to see that the Ritualistic work is kept uniform in its purity and free from innovation or erroneous rendition.

They shall pass upon and decide all matters pertaining to the Ritualistic work, and their decision shall be final, unless changed or modified by the Grand Chapter. All decisions made by the Grand Matron or Grand Patron pertaining to the subject matter herein embraced shall be referred to said committee for final action.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND LAWS.

To the Grand Chapter O. E. S. of California:

Your committee, to whom was referred the report and resolution of the Special Committee appointed on Recommendation No. 1 of the Grand Matron, beg leave to report as follows:

We are of the opinion that to amend or modify the Constitution at this time will be inopportune, for we have not yet emerged from the field of experiment entered into last year. We have given the School of Instruction a trial of one year, and from that experience the Special Committee see some improvements which can be made. Let us not amend the Constitution at present, until we know just what we want; but let us do as we did last year, suspend the operation of Section 19, Article I, until the next communication of the Grand Chapter.

We therefore offer the following resolution and recommend its adoption: Resolved, That the resolution of the Special Committee amending the Constitution be not concurred in, but that instead thereof said Section 19 of Article I of the Constitution be and the same is hereby suspended until the next communication of the Grand Chapter, and that during said time the recommendation of said Committee, introduced as an Amendment of the Constitution, be substituted therefor.

The Grand Secretary then read to the Grand Chapter Recommendations 3, 4, 6 and 7 in report of Worthy Grand Patron, which had been referred by the Committee on Distribution to the Grand Chapter for action.

Recommendation 3 was adopted, recommendations 4 and 7 were referred to the Committee on Finance. No action was taken upon recommendation 6, as the Grand Chapter had already acted upon it in adopting report of Special Committee on Recommendation 1 in report of Worthy Grand Matron, to which Special Committee both recommendations had been referred. Recommendations number 2 and 4, in report of Worthy Grand Matron, were then read and were disposed of as follows: Recommendation 2 was adopted, recommendation 4 was referred to the Committee on Constitution and Laws.

The Worthy Grand Matron Maria Akers Pierce read the following resolution, which was referred to the Finance Committee:

Resolved, That a committee be appointed to procure some suitable and much-needed fittings and appointments for the Grand Secretary's office, with permission and power to expend a sum not to exceed \$200.

The Finance Committee approved the above resolution, recommending that an appropriation of money be made for the purpose stated. The report of the Finance Committee was unanimously adopted.

The Worthy Grand Patron named as the committee to procure suitable furniture for Grand Secretary's office, the Associate Grand Patron George Louis Darling, and Kate Josephine Willats, Grand Secretary.

Bill from Jane Rodecker for services rendered in hat and cloak room for amount of two dollars and fifty cents was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

On motion, which was duly seconded and carried, it was ordered that \$6.75 be refunded to Past Grand Treasurer Jane Frances Raabe, and a warrant for that amount was ordered drawn in her favor.

Past Grand Matron Abbie Elvenia Krebs, Chairman of the Committee on Finance, presented the following reports from that committee:

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

"She leaves us nought but pleasant memories of her life," and sorrow for her death.

SISTER MARIA ANDERSON was born February 3, 1821. She received the degrees of the Order of the Eastern Star by communication April 23, 1869. At that time she was the wife of Brother James Everard, an actor by profession. As an actress Sister Everard had acquired an education in early life which qualified her to become an efficient instructor in the new Order, and on acount of her public experience she was considered to be better fitted than any other Sister to make the enterprise a success, and yet she had no easy task. "Separated by thousands of miles from any other Chapter of the Order, without the advice or assistance of any one capable of instructing the members in the work of ceremonies of a Chapter; surrounded by influences which, if not positively antagonistic, were nevertheless injurious to the prosperity of the Order, it required a hard struggle against difficulties and opposition" to manipulate the crude material into proper form; but Sister Everard proved to be an able assistant to the devoted little band of zealous workers, who had raised our standard colors on this far-off western shore, and their united labor of love reached its fruition on the 23d day of August, 1869, when the first Eastern Star Chapter on this Coast was opened in regular form for the transaction of legitimate business, with Sister Everard in the Chair. Previous to this date 58 had received the degrees by communication. In less than four months afterward 35 members were regularly initiated. December 27, 1869, Sister Everard had the honor of being first elected and installed Worthy Matron in this State. At the close of her year's sevice, in December, 1870, she had received 120 petitions and initiated 103 members; 10 others came into the Chapter later on, making a record unsurpassed in the annals of the Order in California. When she retired from office she received the collar and jewel of a Past Worthy Matron and also a handsome case of silver, but she cherished most, as a precious memento of the past, the practical proof that she was loved and honored by the members of her beloved Chapter, for when death invaded her happy home in June, 1871, and she was left without kindred, alone in her widowhood, the Chapter members were called together to show their sympathy for her bereavement. The Worthy Pauron escorted the Sisters in a body from their Chapter Hall on Post street to the Masonic Temple, where sents had been reserved for them, which was at that time a great innovation. At the Masonic Cemetery, when Mount Moriah Lodge, No. 44, F. & A. M., had finished the sad fraternal rites for their Master. Brother James Everard, they stepped aside, and the Sisters of the Order of the Eastern Star gathered around the weeping widow with kind words of love and tenderness, and while quietly covering the mound which contained the mortal remains of her loved one with their floral offerings, 'instilled hope into her heart until she looked beyond the river and saw the glory of the farther shore." March 10, 1872, Sister Everard was duly installed Worthy Matron of Alameda Chapter, No. 7, and from her saddened home she continued to work for the interests of the Order of the Eastern Star

Some time after she married the genial L. C. Anderson, a brother actor and an old-time friend of her late husband. April 7, 1873, when the delegates from the several Chapters of the Order Eastern Star in this State met to organize a Grand Chapter, Sister Anderson received her reward as the *Pioner Sister Worker* in the Order by being elected and installed the first Worthy Grand Matron of California. She occupied her seat of honor at the first Annual Communication of the Grand Chapter October 15, 1873. The Body then represented nine Subordinate Chapters, and a membership of over 500, as a result of the nucleus formed by fourteen Order Eastern Star members April 8, 1869.

April 23, 1877, Brother and Sister Anderson affiliated with the Parent Chapter and their membership was retained until Death severed the Golden Chain. Sister Anderson buried her second husband about 1885, but while she continued to reside in New York City she never lost her affection for the Order Eastern Star in this State. She was also very much interested in the Masonic Home and wrote to the Grand Secretary, Sister Willats, February 23, 1898, thanking her for some Home information, which she had sent to her by request. Sister Anderson was a true woman, faithful in all her relations of life, and an honor to the Order she helped to establish and love. Bereft, aged and alone, she has seemed to say to her friends: "I am

"Only waiting until the shadows are a little longer grown, Only waiting, till the glimmer of the day's last gleam has flown, Then from out the folded darkness, Holy Deathless Star shall rise, By whose light my soul will gladly wing her passage to the ikies."

SISTER MARY A. SMITH was among the oldest members of our Chapter. On Junuary 31, 1870, she became a member by initiation, receiving that mystic light and knowledge that became the rule of her life, and that was outwardly exemplified in her acts of kindness and good works for all with whom she was associated.

She served the Chapter as Warder in 1872, and in 1873 was chosen to the highest office in our gift, our Worthy Matron, in which office she merited and received the respect and assistance of the officers associated with her, and the fraternal regard and obedience of the members. Her practice of life and earnest labors for the welfare of the Order of the Eastern Star was rewarded by the Grand Chapter of Chapteria, in electing her its Grand Treasurer in 1891. She remained a member of our Chapter for over thirty years, and was called home by Divine command April 8, 1899, at the age of sixty-eight years.

AMENDMENTS

TO THE

CONSTITUTION OF THE GRAND CHAPTER.

ADOPTED OCTOBER, A. D. 1899.

Section 2 of Article I, amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE I.

OFFICERS AND MEMBERS.

The Grand Chapter shall consist of a Grand Patron, Grand Matron, Grand Associate Patron, Grand Associate Matron, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Chaplain, Grand Conductress, Grand Associate Conductress, Grand Marshal, Grand Adah, Grand Ruth, Grand Esther, Grand Martha, Grand Electa, Grand Warder, Grand Organist, Grand Sentinel; all Past Grand Patrons, Past Grand Matrons, Past Grand Associate Patrons, Past Grand Associate Matrons, Past Grand Secretaries, Past Grand Treasurers, District Deputy Grand Matrons, the Matrons, Patrons and Associate Matrons (or such representatives* of Chapters as shall be legally accredited) of every chartered Chapter under its jurisdiction, together with the Past Matrons and Past Patrons of said Chapters; all of whom shall be members in good standing of some Subordinate Chapter within its jurisdiction. Provided, however, that there is hereby created the title of Venerable Past Grand Patron, with all the rights and privileges of membership to be conferred upon our beloved Brother William S. Moses, of Golden Gate Chapter, No. 1, in view of the fact that he was the first Deputy Grand Patron, and as such organized the first Chapters in this State.

The foregoing Officers, Past Officers and Representatives shall be the only voters in this Grand Chapter; they shall have but one vote each, except the first three officers of Subordinate Chapters, or their representatives, either of whom in the absence of his or

her associates may cast the three votes; and the Past Matrons and Past Patrons, who shall be entitled respectively to one collective vote. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer may give the casting vote.

Section 18, Article I, amended to read as follows:

REVENUE.

SEC. 18. The revenue of this Grand Chapter shall be received from the following sources:

For every Dispensation for a new Chapter, which shall afterward be accounted in full for a Charter after-		
wards granted, including four Rituals		00
For a Dispensation other than that for forming a new		
Chapter	3	00
Each Chapter shall pay for every member borne upon		
the roll		25
And also for every member admitted during the year		50

And no Chapter shall be entitled to vote or participate in the transactions of the Grand Chapter until its dues are fully paid.

In addition to the annual dues levied upon the Subordinate Chapters, there shall be levied for each member whose name is borne upon the rolls at the date of the annual returns such sum as the Grand Chapter shall prescribe at each annual session—which shall constitute a special fund, to be denominated the Representative Fund, and it shall be the duty of the several Chapters to pay said sum at the time and in the manner directed for the payment of their annual dues.

At the close of each annual session a committee, to be known as a "Committee on Pay of Members", and to consist of three, shall be appointed by the Grand Patron, whose duty it shall be to ascertain during the year succeeding the exact cost of transportation for one person from the location of each Chapter in the State to the place of meeting of the Grand Chapter and back again, and at the following Annual Session to report such cost of transportation as the sum due to the Officers or Representatives in attendance from each Chapter, which sum shall be paid by the Grand Treasurer—such report being her voucher therefor.

But no payment shall be allowed for the Officers and Representatives of any Chapter, the dues of which shall not have been paid in full.

The Grand Officers and the Chairmen of Standing Committees shall receive payment for their necessary expenditures for transportation to and from each Annual Session of the Grand Chapter in the same manner as ordered for the Officers or Representatives of Chapters, but no Grand Officer, Chairman, or Officer or Representative of a Chapter, shall receive such payment in more than one of those capacities, nor shall he or she receive it unless he or she shall have been in attendance at such session from the first to the last day thereof, inclusive, unless excused by the Grand Chapter.

Article VII amended by adding a new section, numbered 14:

ARTICLE VII.

SECTION 14. No Chapter shall receive nor permit charges to be preferred against any of its officers or members until it be first ascertained that there are ample funds in its treasury, not otherwise appropriated or liable to be drawn upon, to amply pay all expenses which may be incurred by a trial upon such charges; and in no case shall the expenses, or any part thereof, of any trial in a Chapter be a charge upon or paid out of any funds of the Grand Chapter.

Resolved, That Section 9 of Article I of the Constitution be amended by striking out the words "shall preside at the meetings of the Grand Chapter", and inserting in their stead the words "shall assist the Grand Matron in the discharge of her duties."

That Section to of Article I of the Constitution be amended by inserting after the words "the Grand Matron" the following words, "shall preside at the meetings of the Grand Chapter."

The foregoing amendments to the Constitution having received less than the required five-sixths of the votes at this Communication, although a majority voted therefor, lie over for one year. If at our next Annual Communication they shall receive two-thirds of the votes given thereon, "they shall be declared adopted, and after the close of that Communication shall become a part of the Constitution."



REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN CORRESPONDENCE.

To the Grand Officers O. E. S. of the State of California:

It has been our pleasure as your Committee on Foreign Correspondence to review the proceedings of twenty-nine sister Grand Chapters, and we herewith present our report:

ARKANSAS.

The Twenty-third Annual Session of the Grand Chapter of Arkansas met in the City of Little Rock on Monday, the 14th day of November, 1898.

On roll call, five Grand Officers were found absent.

The Order of Business not being in harmony with the Constitution, was suspended in order that the Grand Chapter might be properly constituted before proceeding to the transaction of business.

Palmetto Chapter No. 47 presented to the Grand Chapter a beautiful emblematic star handsomely decorated and painted.

The Worthy Grand Matron was called on for an unusually large number of special dispensations, which were granted. Thinking it would be impossible to visit officially a great number of Chapters, and doubtless good could be done through the medium of correspondence, she wrote eight hundred forty-one letters and received five hundred one. When we note the fact that thirteen defunct Chapters were reorganized, some having been off the roll for years, we conclude that Sister Strong was the right person in the right place.

The Grand Patron reports granting dispensations for five new Chapters. He was able to give but little time to Chapter work, as most of his time has been given to cheering the lonely hours of the one he has so faithfully promised to keep in sickness and in health.

The Secretary reports Charters granted to four Chapters, membership 4,622, a gain of 537, with 123 active Chapters. Balance of cash on hand, \$318.35.

The Committee on Jurisprudence disapproves the decision of the Grand Matron, who says in answer to the question, "Is it necessary for a member of the Order who has been received by affiliation to be re-obligated?" No, signing the By-Laws is all that is necessary. The Committee on Correspondence presents an interesting report of Twenty-two Grand Chapters. California is not mentioned.

COLORADO.

The Sixth Annual Session of this Grand Chapter was held in Masonic Hall at Denver, June 8, 1898, Worthy Grand Matron Mary L. Carr presiding, and representatives from twenty-nine Chapters in attendance.

The Worthy Grand Matron being familiar with the Order from its organization, and seeing its necessities, gave good advice, and reports visiting every Chapter but one.

The Worthy Grand Patron reports the Order prosperous, four new Chapters having been instituted. He predicts interest in the Order as long as education and civilization exist, the Order having passed through the age of an experiment.

Grand Secretary favors limiting sale of Rituals.

Grand Treasurer gives an account of money received and expended. Balance on hand, \$1,476.30.

A ceremony for instituting new Chapters was adopted.

CONNECTICUT.

The Twenty-fifth Annual Session convened in Winsted, October 12, 1808.

The Grand Matron, Sister Minnie E. Willis, presided, and every Grand Officer was present. Brother William Wallace, Past Patron, Massachusetts, was present, and was received in the East and given the Grand Honors.

There were eight Past Grand Matrons present and four Past Grand Patrons.

The Altar was draped in memory of those who had passed to rest during the year. The Grand Secretary read their names, prayer was offered by the Grand Chaplain, and all joined in singing "Nearer, My God, to Thee."

A telegram of greeting was received from Sister Lorraine J. Pitkin, Right Worthy Grand Secretary, also a letter from Sister Nettie Ransford Grand Secretary, Indiana.

The address of the Grand Matron shows her year has been well spent; she has visited all but one Chapter, assisted in organizing four, constituted one, and succeeded in having a monument placed at the grave of the First Grand Patron, Brother Chauncey M. Hatch.

She granted many special dispensations and rendered twelve decisions. She recommends that a new Matron be elected every year; we would say a new Patron also.

She says, with regard to joining the General Grand Chapter: "I shall merely say that every thinking mind recognizes the importance of having a uniform ritual throughout the country. Appreciating this, we have adopted the ritual of the General Grand Chapter. Why not grasp the hand from which we receive the book?"

The Grand Patron has proven his loyalty to the Order by his year's work. He calls the Grand Chapter's attention to the fact that financially they are verging on bankruptcy, and recommends that they increase the per capita tax of Subordinate Chapters from five to ten cents.

The Committee on Foreign Correspondence reports twenty-six Grand Chapter Proceedings reviewed, California's for 1897 being among the number.

The Twenty-sixth Annual Session will be held in New Haven, the second Wednesday in October, 1899.

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

The "Proceedings" embraces the records of the Third Semi-annual meeting held June 4, 1898, for the purpose of exemplifying the work and to act on the report of committee work; a special session July 23, 1898, to transact business relative to the approaching session of the General Grand Chapter; also to take action relative to raising a fund for the benefit of sick and wounded soldiers and sailors of the present war.

The Third Annual Session held January 7, 1899, opened in ample form with the Worthy Grand Matron presiding. The Associate Grand Patron, Brother M. T. Dixon, and Sister Ida M. Tomlinson, Grand Ruth, were reported absent.

The members of the O. E. S. in this Jurisdiction are certainly very loyal. They not only attend the regular sessions, but respond to the call for "special meetings" as often as it suits the convenience of the Grand Matron to call one. Why not have a session of two or three days, and give the Jurisprudence Committee time to report?

The Masonic Fair, held in April, gave the members of the O. E. S. an opportunity to manifest in a substantial manner their interest in the erection of a Masonic Temple; as a result, \$1,435.96 is placed to their credit in the treasury of the Board of Control.

The Grand Matron refers to the Triennial session of the General Grand Chapter as the most important event of the year, which has been one of substantial prosperity. The reports from the several Chapters show a net gain in membership of 213, an increase of 39 for the year. Total membership enrolled, 1,353.

Only one question was presented for decision, eight special dispensations granted.

The Grand Patron, in company with the Grand Matron, made two official visits during the year to each of the constituent Chapters.

The Grand Patron reports his official acts and says the prospects are bright for the future welfare and prosperity of the Order.

From the Grand Matron's address we note the following: "I am also in favor of the abrogation of the custom of bestowing Representative Commissions on Grand Matrons, believing those officers are sufficiently honored by their position, and that a wider distribution of such honors, to which any member of the Grand Chapter is eligible, would be more beneficial."

She recommends that a salary of \$100.00 a year be allowed the Grand Secretary, and that a committee be appointed to formulate plans for establishing a "Home," to be under the auspices of the Grand Chapter of the District of Columbia.

The Committee on Foreign Correspondence presents a very interesting report in which California is pleasantly reviewed. However, our Sister Correspondent feels sorry to see our Grand Matron granted dispensations to receive and ballot on petitions the same evening as received. Since California Grand Chapter gives her that privilege, I see no harm done.

An address of welcome was given by the Worthy Matron of Purity Chapter, Livonia M. Green, responded to by Grand Organist Lucille Waldren. The address of the Worthy Grand Matron is patriotic and good advice is given.

Dispensations were granted to organize nine new Chapters. The Secretary was able to obtain reports from but twenty-nine Chapters out of fifty. One hundred twenty-six dollars, twenty cents, was given to the Orphans' Home.

INDIANA.

The Twenty-fourth Session of this Grand Chapter convened on April 27, 1898. The "Proceedings" contains portraits of sixteen Past Grand Matrons and twenty-one Past Grand Patrons, together with those of the present Grand Matron and Grand Patron, and is a beautiful souvenir well worth being proud of.

Representatives were present from one hundred sixty-five Chapters.

The Grand Matron, Sister Conrad, in her address reports a vast amount of work done; she personally visited thirty Chapters, to do so traveling four thousand miles, and has written seven hundred nineteen letters. She rendered thirty decisions, which were approved.

Sister Conrad says that "her heart is in her work," yet we feel that it is with a sigh of relief that she laid down her official burden.

The Grand Patron, C. B. Stemen, gave a short but interesting report of his official acts. Seventeen Chapters were instituted and nine constituted. In each case a Sister was commissioned Grand Patron's Deputy.

A portrait of the good Brother is found on page 50 of the Proceedings. The Grand Matron then addressed the Grand Chapter, beautifully outlining the work of the session, and reporting her official acts.

That Sister Gladding has been a tireless and efficient officer is fully proven by the amount of work she reports; she not only visited some 60 Chapters, but gave her attention and assistance in providing comforts for the Masonic Home. She has written 1,000 letters and rendered 10 decisions.

The Grand Patron is not behind, for he reports 12 new Chapters instituted; his recommendations are well worth study and imitation.

The new officers were supplied a new set of jewels at a cost of \$100.00.

The Grand Secretary reports a balance in the Treasury.

The report of the Memorial Committee is very beautiful, and pages dedicated to the deceased members are made very expressive by a verse on each, of the grand Scotch poem, "In the Palace of the King."

Sister Inez L. Shipman, at the eleventh hour, filled the vacancy on the Committee on Foreign Correspondence and reviews 26 Grand Proceedings.

PENNSYLVANIA.

The Fifth Annual Session of the Grand Chapter of Pennsylvania was held at Duke Centre, commencing November 15th.

Zellafro, in which she says, "I am glad this Order is in the line of moral advancement, that it does not limit its members to either sex; that it recognizes the individual's debt to society, and has done so, keeping its ethical standard one of the highest."

The simile is good, but let us not be content with a resemblance, rather let us strive to make a reality. The Subordinate Chapters are the links in the chain, welded to the Grand Chapter by vows of loyalty and obedience."

The address of the Grand Matron occupies 16 pages of the Proceedings, and is almost entirely given to a review of her visitations; she reports visiting every Chapter in the Jurisdiction, and that four new links have been added. She feels sure her successor "will reap an abundant harvest from the good seed she has sown."

The Grand Patron's address is brief, but one can read in every line of it that he is fully alive to the best interests of our beloved Order.

From the Secretary and Treasurer's reports we find a membership of 755 and \$307.40 in the funds.

The Committee on Foreign Correspondence reviews the proceedings of 20 Grand Chapters, California included.

A vote of thanks was tendered the retiring Grand Officers.

The next annual session of the Grand Chapter will be held in Philadelphia, November 21, 1899.

The Grand Secretary's report shows a small increase of membership. A resolution of thanks was extended to the Most Worthy Grand Matron Mary E. Partridge, who was present, for her helpful suggestions.

A resolution was offered, but defeated, that the dues of male members of Buffalo Chapter be remitted.

The Grand Matron in her address paid a loving tribute to the memory of their much loved sister, Mary C. Fenton, Past Grand Matron, whose death occurred May 5, 1897. The sweet face of the departed sister graces the first page of the proceedings.

The address of the Grand Matron is a good one, showing a year of work well done; she reports the growth of the Order most gratifying; she visited 45 out of 48 Chapters; all would have been visited if meetings could have been arranged.

The Grand Patron gives some good advice in his address; he issued dispensations for the formation of two new Chapters. In closing his address, he says that although he has been asked many questions as regards the law of the Order he has referred all such inquiries to the Grand Matron, thinking the right of government is vested in the sisters.

The Grand Secretary has given a good report on everything done during the year. Balance of cash on hand, \$1,882.61.

Among the many good things in this report, which is pleasant to look upon, are the portraits of Sister Lou Jordan, Grand Matron, and Brother Yancy C. Blalock, Grand Patron.

We really appreciate the write up that Sister Van Patten gave us under the head of Fraternal Correspondence; perhaps when we are as long in the service as she, we may be able to make our reports more interesting.

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
